## Letter from the Benefice Rector

A Searching out and being found There is a fourteenth century Catalan Mystery play called 'el caganer' (look it up for its English translation) which tells the story of a shepherd who is visited by an angel and told where to find the Christ in the manger, but who takes a detour on the way as he is desperate for the loo. The detour and the delay are costly and the poor hapless shepherd misses the holy family. In the staging of the play the shepherd sits centre stage, crouching, with his trousers round his ankles...a striking reminder that when it comes to searching for Christ, nothing should hold us up.

Over Christmas, through the re-telling of the nativity story, we are reminded of the various people who went on sometimes lengthy journeys in order to search for Jesus. The astrologers (possibly pagan sorcerers) who take an unconventional route and use unconventional means to seek out and kneel before Jesus. The shepherds whose searching out of Christ is surprising simply because of who they are and their impossibly low status. And Anna and Simeon who meet Jesus about a month late and in no rush or hurry.

Each of these people sought out Jesus in order to bless him, but in meeting him they discovered that in fact they were the ones who were blessed. Blessed by seeing Gods salvation, holding in their arms the unlikely means of God redeeming the world.

We're reminded through the whole story that we need to get ourselves in gear and actively seek Jesus out, make an effort and persevere. And that having done so the rewards are pretty life changing.

But this is only half the story because as the gospels continue we see, alongside people finding Jesus, that Jesus also finds people. That as well as being sought out Jesus also seeks out. The gospels are full of incidents where Jesus takes the initiative and actively seeks someone out and engages with them, offering them the life changing blessing of forgiveness and restoration. The Christian story is one of searching out and also of being found.

As a new year begins I wonder if this is the time to do one of two things depending on our own situation:

Firstly to recommit to searching For Christ - in the business of day to day life, at home, at work, at school, in heart and in mind - to encounter the one who is the Son of God. That sometimes all we need to do is look.

Secondly to allow ourselves to be found by Christ. To understand that he searches us out with the intention of blessing and saving. That sometimes all we need to do is not hide from him.

There are many ways to do this. One way is to be part of the community of people who are actively searching and being found, we call it the church. Get involved in the rhythms of worship and prayer that have sustained Christians in so many times and places and see what you might find. Another way is to get involved in an enquirers course. As a network of Churches we tend to run Alpha courses, and there are several starting in January.

Happy New Year everyone! I hope you had a fantastic Christmas holidays with friends and family!



## **Local Police Report**

Dear residents

May I begin with wishing you all a very Happy New Year.

As we start a new year I will update residents on the state of reported crime within their respective parishes in future editions, suffice to say that crime increased across the whole of the beat area with an increase in both non-dwelling burglaries of outbuildings and criminal damage reports including several when unknown people drove around both our own and neighbouring areas firing ball bearings from a vehicle aiming at parked cars, house windows etc.

Returning back to the tail end of 2019, I am seeking any information in relation to the following crimes reported in the area of this magazine. At about 3am on  $15^{\text{th}}$  November 2019 a burglary to an outbuilding took place in Tunworth Down where chainsaws etc. were stolen. Overnight of November  $25^{\text{th}} / 26^{\text{th}}$  again in Tunworth whilst the roads were closed further outbuildings were broken into as indeed was further outbuildings at Herriard Grange overnight of December  $1^{\text{st}}$  and  $2^{\text{nd}}$ . And overnight of December  $12^{\text{th}} / 13^{\text{th}}$  a lawn was driven over at a private residence in Weston Patrick and damage was caused.

Slightly further afield on December 3<sup>rd</sup> 2019 a grey Nissan pick-up RE16 ONF was seen in Ellisfield cold calling offering to see if anyone wanted any building, patio or driveways work undertaken.

On the same day a barn was broken into at College Farm where a quad bike and 4x4 buggy was stolen. I ask if anyone was in that area and saw anything suspicious or vehicles parked up in College Lane,

## New Year Recipe - Mac Cheese with leeks and bacon

1. Put macaroni into salted boiling water and cook according to packet instructions.

2. Meanwhile, heat olive oil or butter in a deep pan and fry bacon lardons, until coloured. Add finely sliced leeks and cook gently.

3. Stir couple of tblsp of flour into the leeks and bacon, cook gently for a couple of minutes.

4. Gradually stir in milk to form a roux sauce ( should have consistency of double cream).

5. Add grated cheddar cheese, stir until melted, then add drained macaroni and stir.

6. Transfer Mac cheese to a buttered ovenproof dish, top with more cheese and place in preheated oven 180 fan for 20 mins, or until nicely browned.

7. Serve with crusty bread and green salad!


