Dear Friends,

I wonder how many of us are comfortable with change? We all have to deal with change throughout our lives.

Our bodies change, babies grow into children and children into adults, which are exciting changes. And then as we get older our bodies continue to change and bits stop working or don't work as well as they used to, so it is yet another change we have to cope with.

There have been changes in the Church of England too: Did you know that in 1901 there were 25,000 clergy. In the 1960's there were 15,700. In 2016 there were only 7,790.

There will be changes happening in our network of churches too. There are going to be staff changes: Mary-Beth Hawrish and I will be leaving at the end of January and Helen O'Sullivan will be gone by the summer, new Vicars and Curates will be appointed, new personalities, new habits to cope with, perhaps different styles of sermons? And there will also have to be a change in our service patterns, what we have always known may not be quite the same again.

Changes in our lives whether they are our choice or they are thrust upon us can be very frightening and uncomfortable. We can feel out of control and uncertain, they can make us doubt.

In the bible there is a great story, found in Matthew 14: 25-32, of Peter stepping out of the boat he was in to join Jesus who was walking on the lake. In the changes, storms and chaos of our lives let us think about the kind of faith that Peter had to step out of that boat.

He was the only disciple with the courage to get out of the boat and walk towards Jesus. As long as he kept his eyes fixed on Jesus he was alright.

Peter steps out of that boat in faith and in faithfulness; and we too are called to step out in faith, even in the midst of troubled waters. Stepping out in faith is not a guarantee that we will not face troubled waters or be filled with fear, but we have to remember that it is always accompanied by the assurance that Jesus will not abandon us.

When Peter became distracted by the raging storm he became aware of what he was doing, he lost confidence and began to sink. When we feel overwhelmed by change we need to think of Peter, and take a step of faith, keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus. Remember the authority and power of Jesus as he immediately held his hand out to the sinking Peter.

Sometimes our fears and anxieties can prevent us from doing anything, we can become helpless and immobile, faith is not being unafraid, but facing our fears and taking the risk. Facing our fear of change is a challenge we all have to face, throughout our lives, getting out of the boat like Peter did is the most risky, most exciting and most fulfilling way to live life to the fullest.

And my prayer for our network of churches is that together we be bold and will have the courage to take that step of faith, keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, being ready to follow him wherever that may be, and to do his will in this place, whatever that may be.

Kids Zone

Hi again everyone! As this magazine comes out, you'll probably be thinking about bonfires, toasted marshmallows and fireworks! I wonder if you every helped someone set a fire? There are lots of different tips about how to get your fire going – but I think we'd all agree that one of the most important would be choosing nice dry wood... and this reminds me of one of the craziest stories in the Bible about a man who didn't quite follow that rule!! His name was Elijah. Elijah was frightened – he was a prophet of God, but the King of his country worshipped a different god called Baal. Elijah wanted to prove his God was the real one so, even though he felt frightened, he challenged the other priests to a

competition. He was going to prove once and for all that his god was the real God and not Baal.

They each prepared a huge bonfire. Elijah dared his enemies to ask their God to set the bonfire alight. (They didn't have matches in those days!!) They started first thing in the morning, shouting and screaming and asking their god to set the fire alight. By lunchtime, Elijah even started taunting them, telling them to shout louder, that they'd never be able to do it – but they kept on shouting!

Eventually, Elijah had had enough, he told everyone to come to him, so he could have his turn. By this time, he's getting a bit cocky – so he tells the servants to pour 12 large jars of water onto the fire (Hint: don't

try this on your bonfire at home – it really doesn't help it set alight…!) He then said a quiet prayer and you'll never guess what happened next – the fire set alight and burned so hot that even the soil was scorched!!

So, while you're watching an adult fumble with the matches on bonfire night, why don't you tell them the story of



Elijah? And if you're ever in a situation where everyone around you says or does something you think isn't right, why don't you say a quiet prayer and remember God is on your side?

There are loads more exciting stories about Elijah, including when he was fed by ravens – check your Old Testament to find out more!

NEWS FROM THE VILLAGES

Local police report

Dear residents,

I start this month with a report of an increase in **burglary of outbuildings**, sheds etc. from all across our area. Herriard has been the main area with several offences having taken place at the time of writing, a theft of a motorcycle and garden machinery and garden equipment having been stolen. The locations have been both in and around the village. May I ask if you could please look at the dates and times (when

known) below and if you have CCTV within that area, may I ask if you could please check to see if there is any movement on your systems that may help.

21/23:09:19 – Garden shed just outside Weston Patrick – garden equipment stolen

23.09.19 between 0250 & 0300 – Sheds, Royal British Legion, garage Southrope, Shed public house and van broken into at Southrope

07.10.19 - Business premises on Bagmore Lane, Herriard

7/8.10.19 – Three sheds Weston Patrick village – tools & pair of boots stolen

09/10.10.19 – Electricity substation Bagmore Lane – metal containers broken into – property stolen

5/13.10.19 – garage house in The Avenue – theft of an orange Kubuta mini tractor

I have researched these crimes and established that several of the victims were subject to the same type of crime, i.e. outbuildings etc. broken into back in 2016. If you have been a victim and had your shed, garage or outbuilding broken into in 2016/17/18 then please make sure your security is as best as it could be. Frequently as in these cases the thieves will come back and steal the replacements that you have purchased after they stole the previous ones.

I cannot reiterate enough that residents need to improve security, sadly some of the crimes above were from unlocked sheds, or alarms fitted but not switched on, sadly we all need to protect our property, please record serial numbers, mark property with your house number/initials and postcode, photograph the expensive items.

Also please do not leave them in sheds where criminals can look through the windows and see what you have. **Make things difficult for thieves**: add shed alarms which can be battery operated, as a rule thieves will make off if an alarm or censor lighting goes off. That said, in Brown Candover when challenged the thieves did assault a resident, but this is very rare and I again appeal for any information from anyone who was driving on the B3046 on the night, about midnight on Saturday September 29th and of whom would have passed a Subaru type vehicle parked in a driveway, perhaps as the thieves got into their vehicle, four men wearing balaclavas, can you help with this?

If you can help with any information no matter how slight or unimportant that you feel it is, please let me know and call me direct.

Autumn has arrived in a blaze of colour! Sunny days, chilly nights and the smell of woodsmoke in the air. Wonderful!

The Herriard Gardening Club have been busy in their allotment, harvesting bountiful crops of produce, all turned into culinary delights for our Annual Allotment Supper.

A great big thank you to everyone who made the evening such a huge success. We all enjoyed tomato soup, vegetable curry, frittata, followed by beetroot and chocolate cake, blackberry and apple muffins and carrot cake! What a lovely way to use our home grown fruit and veg.

Here is Becky's recipe for her delicious beetroot and chocolate cake:

1 large cooked beetroot, roughly chopped 200g plain flour

1 tbsp baking powder

100g cocoa powder

250g golden caster sugar

3 eggs

2 tsp vanilla extract

200ml sunflower oil

100g dark chocolate, chopped into pieces

- 1. Heat oven to 190c/fan 170c/gas 5.
- 2. Tip the beetroot into a food processor and blitz.
- 3. Add a pinch of salt and the rest of the ingredients, except the oil and chocolate.
- 4. When completely mixed, add the oil in a steady stream.
- 5. When all the oil has been added, stir in the chocolate, then tip the mix into a lined 900g loaf tin.
- 6. Cook for 1 hr until an inserted skewer comes out practically clean.
- 7. Leave the loaf to cool on a rack. Serve with clotted cream.

Looking forward to our **Christmas Get Together**, which this year will be held in the British Legion on **Wednesday December 4th at 6.30pm**. I will be posting more details on our members Facebook page.

Herriard & Lasham with Bentworth WI

Our talk this month was given by Mr Boniface Mpano a senior Elder of a Kenyan Maasai tribe. Mr Mpano arrived in full Maasai dress of bright red with beautiful hand made belt and jewellery, making quite an impact on the ladies of the W.I.

He explained that there are 14 different nomadic tribes of Maasai, 10 in Kenya and 4 in Tanzania, who move with their cattle, sheep and goats, following the grazing and water supply for the animals. They build temporary villages which consist of 5 family groups each and the animals are housed every night in the centre of the village to keep them safe from lions and other marauding predators. The tribes are totally dependent on their animals; their main diet is meat and milk. All other parts of the animals are used for clothing, jewellery, cooking etc.

Boniface told us that the sandals are now made from recycled tyres which last longer than the animal hide ones they used to wear. They call them thousand mile shoes as they are so hard wearing. He has recently climbed Mount Snowden in his!

The Maasai do not celebrate birthdays, instead they have celebrations for achieving status within the tribe. After learning to tend to the animals, they then train as warriors. The next promotion is to junior Elder and finally to senior Elder. Each level requires certain tasks to be completed before moving on to the next.

A fascinating talk covering lifestyle, culture, traditions, whilst also acknowledging the changes occurring due to tourism, especially the safaris. These provide employment which helps the tribes pay for their children to go to school.

Boniface also had the most beautiful and intricate jewellery, made from horn, beads, seed pods and shells, for sale. This was all hand made by the women of the tribe and the proceeds are to help fund wheelchairs for the disabled tribes people. If you would like to make a donation there is a crowdfunding page on facebook.

We warmly thanked our speaker who joined us for coffee and cake before taking his leave.


