From the Benefice Ministry Team

One of the deeper questions I keep asking myself at the moment is: What causes division? One of the central causes, I would argue, is thinking that difference means less. Perhaps that's why one of the central teachings of Jesus was 'love your neighbour as yourself.' (Matthew 22.39) Every person that is not you is different from you. They are unique, but here's the jam – you are unique. Do you look in the mirror and marvel at the uniqueness of your personality, your gifting and



the fact God thinks you're fearfully and wonderfully made? Not in vanity but in appreciation that there is no one like you? God made you for a reason: the world needs you. Everyone is called into creation uniquely, yes, all with limitations, but all fearfully and wonderfully made.

Sometimes when we encounter another we take refuge in the harbour of their similarities. We think 'phew, this bit is like me.' This is helpful for stability and comfort, but often in society (and in church) we end up creating settlements within these harbours of similarity, from which we neither venture nor allow others in. Soon, the fact we are all incredibly different becomes a myth, and what we end up loving in the neighbour is the 'us' we see in them. This doesn't mean we don't need to recognise common ground, however, perhaps we need to ask 'what is the best and most true common ground that should be recognised?' What is true unity?

I believe that the truest unity can be found in God. All God is and does: love, grace, peace, justice, mercy... (the list is inexhaustible) is the truest common ground that we find with one another, and all God isn't: namely evil, that which causes hurt, selfishness, fear and prejudice, is not common ground. We may think that those that do evil have unity with one another, but this is a false unity. In the end, evil results in division and death. Lighten up dude! I end up saying to myself – but yes! The light God shines reveals that which is not united under love and grace – exposing those places where we need to love our neighbour!

So what am I going to do about it? We can start by understanding that difference is more. God is always more, his mercies are new every morning, we discover more about him the more he is revealed in the world. So then, the more difference we encounter, the more is revealed about God. The more diversity we have in our societies, the more we know the amazingness of each other, and our society is richer only when we come to know unity-in-diversity. So who is missing? Does every unique person have access to all places in our churches, in our villages, in our hearts?

Loving our neighbour is alive and well here in our communities with the amazing work of so many that seek a common ground of love and grace. For example, those who are welcoming and supporting Ukrainian people, those who seek equality for voices unheard, those who support one another in the time of need; there are so many that take risks in stepping out to encounter difference. I'm thankful that everyone (including you) is uniquely created to make and be the difference in the world!

Happy International Families Day!

Those of you who read Kidzone regularly will know one of my favourite movies at the moment is *Encanto*

from Disney. (Grandparents, if you haven't watched it with the grandchildren – what's taken you so long?!)



Almost the very first thing you hear in the movie is the song 'The Family Madrigal' song. In it, we are introduced to the main characters of the film - a big family filled with people with all different gifts and



powers. (If you have a QR code reader on your smartphone, you can scan this QR code to listen to the song now!)

Now, we might not have a family quite like the Madrigals, but we're all surrounded by special people who are good at all sorts of different things. Who's in your family? Not just your parents and brothers and sisters, but aunts, uncles, cousins... maybe even close family friends feel like family to you!

Sometimes it's really easy to take our family for granted. Assume that Mum will always cook our favourite meal, that Dad will come and play football with us at the park, that our brother or sister will share their toys with us, but maybe this International Families Day we should spend a moment appreciating them... I wonder what is the thing that means the most to you about your family? What do you really love about each of the people in your family.

Let's make a special family chain to help us remember how amazing our family is!

- 1. Take a piece of paper, and fold concertina-style (as if you are making a paper fan). Keep going until you have folded the whole sheet of paper.

Police Report from PCSO Andy Jones

A resident of Nutley has reported a Burglary believed to have occurred in the early hours of 20th March. A quad bike and a lurcher dog were stolen. Two more Burglaries occurred, also in the early hours of the morning, in the areas of Chilton Candover and Winslade. Again quad bikes have been targeted. Please take the opportunity to harden security and, if you or someone you know has a quad bike, please take every precaution to prevent it from being stolen. Your local Officer is always willing to offer crime prevention advice.

We are all feeling the pinch in relation to fuel bills. Historically, when the price of oil has increased, the theft of the product also increases. A brochure which touches on useful advice in making life difficult for the thief is at https://www.thesombornes.org.uk/upload_docs/695.pdf.

Theft of used cooking oil is also on the increase nationwide and many of the rural pubs and restaurants have been targeted. Police have some lines of enquiry and work is going on in the background.

On 26th March, Police attended Berrydown road in Axford after a horse had an incident involving a car. There is no fault to either party in relation to this incident; significant damage was caused to the vehicle and, sadly, the horse had to be euthanized due to its injuries.

On another note your local Beat Officer has signed up to abseil down the Spinnaker Tower in Portsmouth in aid of Sebastian's Actions Trust. This has been booked for June this year so fingers crossed and, Covid allowing, it should be a challenging day. Given I am currently a prisoner in my own home suffering from Covid, I should have enough antibodies not to affect my event – fingers crossed!

Superfast Fibre Implementation

There has been talk in the press of Fibre broadband projects being suspended and I have queried this with Openreach.

They have confirmed that this will not affect our implementation and work is still progressing with a target completion of end May 2022.

Farming News

It felt good to dig my shorts out of the drawer as I did in mid-March when the temperatures rose into the 20's. Not so good to return them again towards the end of the month as the temperatures plummeted and we had heavy frosts and snow: a fools' spring! We did however get the opportunity to finally put several groups of heifers out to grass on 8th April, as the weather turned warmer and the grass started to grow.

These heifers are youngsters and have been in the barns all winter so have never been out at grass. It's a joy to watch them, timid at first and then running and kicking their heels while they explore the boundaries of their new playground. It's one of the highlights of our farming year and signals the true arrival of spring. Before we let them out, we weigh them so we can track their growth rates. They need to gain 0.8 to 0.9kg of weight per day, to enable them to calve down with their first calf at two years old, the optimum age for our Holstein breed, giving them every chance to live a long, productive and healthy life.

Talking of long, productive and healthy lives, you may remember me writing about our oldest cow, Shrek Lady 6 back in March last year. She has now produced 157,000 litres of milk and has reached the grand old age of 14 years but has all but stopped producing now. It's nearly time to say goodbye to her which will be tough for all of us at the dairy – by far the hardest part of our job. Many of her daughters and granddaughters are milking in the herd so her bloodline will continue and flourish.

Field work is full on at this time of year. Hopefully. by the time you read this, our maize will be planted and we'll be getting very close to our first cut of grass silage. Last year's silage wasn't particularly good because of the very wet, cold May we had. The sugar content and the energy levels were down which meant we've had to supplement our cow ration with extra wheat which we've had to buy in. With the appalling situation in Ukraine and, as a consequence, the wheat price rising, this has added three pence per litre on the cost of producing our milk. So we're hoping for a warm sunny May to produce good quality grass silage, as well as, on a humanitarian level, praying for a resolution to the Ukrainian catastrophe.

We've been using straw that we baled last summer for feed and bedding all winter. However, we have not touched the straw in one of our barns because this has provided an ideal home to a beautiful barn owl. We're hoping this will become a nesting site. Barn owls generally lay their eggs late March or early April, with another 30 days before they hatch. It can be a good 10 weeks before the young barn owls are independent, so we'll keep a keen eye on the barn and not touch the straw if there is the slimmest chance she has some young. Let's hope she does! **Joe Ives**

We wish to thank most sincerely all of you who regularly give to St Mary's Church for your support. Your generosity greatly helps in providing a predictable source of income essential for financial planning. This has been more important than ever during the last two years.

St Mary's income suffered as a result of Covid. We had to cancel our main fund-raising events, including the church fete, and also lost fee income. Our overall income fell by more than $\pounds 13,000$ in 2020 and by more than $\pounds 9,000$ in 2021, compared to pre-Covid levels.

The Choir of Queen's College, Oxford, will also be joining us for Evensong on Sunday 1st May, at 4.30 pm, followed by drinks. You are warmly welcome.

Your continuing support is greatly appreciated in enabling us to plan ahead and ensure that St Mary's continues its active role at the heart of our community.

Herriard Gardening Club

Well, the members of our club certainly don't need to go to the gym!

Veolia very kindly donated five tons of Progrow compost, known as 'Black Gold'. It arrived at our allotment last Friday. It was like a huge black mountain! We soon got a system going, a few muscles on the barrow filling and others wheeling and depositing! The beds look amazing; the compost was still warm which in itself will speed up germination. We have such a deep covering that the amount of weeds will be suppressed. Great news! A huge pat on the back to all who helped.

As it is the best time to put compost on our garden, I thought I would let you have a tried and tested recipe for the best compost. It's one that I have always used in my own compost heap. The original recipe came from Monty Don, so thank you Monty!

Here it is: What to add to your compost bin – and what to leave out *Nitrogen-rich waste (green):* Grass clippings, annual weeds, fruit and veg peelings, nettle leaves, teabags

Carbon-rich waste (brown): prunings, hedge trimmings, paper or newspaper (loosely scrunched up is best), cardboard, straw, sawdust, pet bedding, paper towels, paper bags

Also add: eggshells, natural fibres (wool or cotton), wood ash (not too much)

Don't add: diseased plants, perennial weeds, cooked food, citrus (slow to rot and very acidic, which reduces worm activity), raw meat, dairy products, gloss or colour-printed paper, ash from coal fires, cat or dog faeces, autumn leaves – these are best used to make leaf mould

Don't forget to turn the compost now and again, the combination of the above will create a lot of heat, needed for microorganisms to break down the matter. Cover your compost to keep out the rain. When the compost turns brown and crumbly it is ready, normally within six months.

Have fun in the garden and compost heap this month.

I think we can safely say that it is here – SPRING of course! It is my favourite time of year, especially in the garden, seeing all those treasured plants poking their heads up, having survived the winter and commiserating about those which didn't make it.

It seems that we have to keep our eyes peeled for yet another unwelcome visitor to our shores. As yet it is in small numbers, and would be especially problematic to our fruits and vegetables, should it become widespread. It goes by the name of Brown Marmorated Stink Bug. To the untrained eye it looks just like our common green or brown shield bug. You can find more information on Google – particularly the Natural History Museum site.

Following on with the Theme of the Uses and Exploitation of Wood!

This month it is the Cypress Tree *Cupressus sempervirens* which comes into focus!



Cypress Tree in Iran, 4,000 years-old!

Common Name: Mediterranean Cypress.

Distribution: Eastern Mediterranean region.

Tree Size: 20-30 m tall, 0.6-1 m trunk diameter.

Average Dried Weight: 33 lbs/ft3 (535 kg/m3).

Colour/Appearance: Heartwood is a pale yellowish or reddish brown. Narrow sapwood is paler and usually clearly demarcated from the heartwood.

Common Uses: Boatbuilding, utility timber, fence posts, musical instruments, furniture, and turned objects like bowls and dishes.

In the Book of Genesis, we encounter Noah, one of the Bible's first woodworkers. God revealed his plan to destroy a humanity by flooding the earth. He gave Noah a 120-year project to build an Ark, giving him and his three sons precise instructions and dimensions. The Ark was to be 300 cubits long, 50 cubits wide and 30 cubits high, approximately (450' long x 75' wide x 45' high). The vast structure was to be built out of cypress wood.

Jesus, of course, was also a carpenter. Carpenters at the time of Jesus, were called upon to make or repair ploughs, threshing sleds, or to cut a beam for a roof. New doors and door frames would have been required. On occasion they might be asked to make smaller items, such as a cabinet to contain Scripture rolls. Jesus would have learnt these woodworking skills from his adoptive father Joseph.

In an effort to encourage young people to become involved in woodworking and wood craft, next month's insert will focus on our involvement in the Upton Grey Church fete and how we will invite young people to become involved, by the construction of a simple box with various applications.

Getting Wild About Gardens – Hampshire & IofW Wildlife Trust

The buzz of a bee... the sweet scent of honeysuckle... the splash of a frog hopping into a pond... chattering birds in a hedge. These precious moments are not only delightful to experience in our gardens, they're vital if we're going to protect, restore and reconnect UK wildlife.

Since 2013, The Wildlife Trusts have partnered with the Royal Horticultural Society on our Wild About Gardens initiative – encouraging everyone with a garden to provide food and shelter for wildlife. In fact, you don't even need a garden to get involved: window-boxes, a bee brick in your wall, or flower-rich balconies can all make a difference.

So, why is it so important for us to dedicate our own patch to wildlife? Well, almost 90% of UK households have a garden. This equates to over 20 million gardens, which, incredibly, covers a larger area than all 2,300 Wildlife Trust nature reserves combined. With many UK species in decline, using these spaces means we can collectively make a huge difference to wildlife. It doesn't even have to involve lots of time and money because letting nature take its own course is often the best way.

We're dedicating this year's Wild About Gardens to our high-flying summer visitors – swifts, swallows, and house martins. Swifts and house martins were recently added to the UK's Red List for birds, meaning they have suffered severe declines and require urgent action.

The simplest thing you can do is let a patch of grass grow long, or plant a colourful wildflower border – both will encourage insects in your garden, essential food for these birds. Creating a boggy garden patch will provide mud that swallows and house martins use to build their nests. To encourage nesting, consider installing a swift box or brick.
