Letter from the Benefice Ministry Team

I have at home a rather old and battered book, to be fair the reason it came my way was because it was battered. When my father worked for the Duke of Norfolk at Arundel Castle Mr Fishpool, the Duke's steward, who was going to dispose of it, thought Dad might like the book for "Your boy". So it came home; admittedly as I was four at the time I had to grow into it but when I did I got a great deal of pleasure from it.



The book in question, published in 1886 written by the Rev Forbes Winslow, is "The Children's Fairy Geography". Inside the cover it is inscribed "Gwendolen C Maxwell from her affectionate mother". Gwendolen Constable-Maxwell was to marry the 14th Duke of Norfolk, which is presumably how the book came to be at the castle. It takes two children Ethel (the author's daughter) and Jack on a series of make believe journeys around Europe so there will be need for packing, or dressing in the dark by candlelight. Sometimes they will travel by steam boat or steam train but when there is a distance to travel then they will go by wishing carpet or with the aid of electric boots.

The journey begins in England, "What are the English like?" the author asks "I think they are very nice people" although he qualifies that later "Of course there are many naughty people in England". Writing for the August magazine I found myself thinking about my old book because August is the month in which many organisations take a break to recharge the batteries for a fresh start in September. It's a time when we think about holidays even though the days when works closed down for a fortnight in August are long gone.

To go with holidays, papers recommend books to take away with you – it may even be the opportunity to read the book you've been meaning to read since you were given it at Christmas, perhaps something to deepen your understanding, increase your knowledge, hopefully to challenge your perceptions rather than feed your prejudice. Books can take us on adventures, to distant places, to encounter all sorts of people, take us out of ourselves and the everyday world.

For a bargain you could do worse than the bible; nearly seventy books within its covers. Like Ethel and Jack you'll be off on a voyage of discovery – sublime poetry and prose, even one of the greatest love poems ever written – you'll plumb the depths and scale the heights – weep with those who weep, rejoice with those who rejoice.

You'll find simple age old stories which seek to explain why things are as they are. You'll travel with a people on their journey to become the people of their God, hear them castigated when they get it wrong and people known as prophets lay on the line how it should be. You'll read stories of high adventure and derring-do as well as stories of veniality, corruption, cowardice and betrayal. You'll meet a man and, like the people of his time, find yourself asked the question "Who is this?" "What manner of man is he?" You'll travel with people who took the good news about who he was across the known world of their time without regard to their own safety and you'll see what a mixed reception they got. You'll see how people of his time and soon after sought to explain just who he was and the difference he could make to life.

You'll but it's time to go get my electric boots – happy journeying whatever you read!

NEWS FROM THE VILLAGES

August Farming News

August on the farm means harvest time. Although as I write this, there are persistent showers floating around and it isn't feeling very summer like, I hope that by the time you are reading this we are well underway with our combinable harvest. I say combinable as we have already started harvest, in a round about way. Our Hybrid Rye was forage harvested in the last week of June. This is to supply the Anaerobic Digester (AD) plant in Herriard. The forage harvester cuts the plant off near the bottom of the stalk and chops the whole plant up into small pieces roughly 10 mm long. This is so when it is fed into the AD plant, it can be digested efficiently. Much like a cow. Yields were a good average and some that we are pleased with, which hopefully bodes well for the rest of the harvest. Our first crop to be harvested will be the Oil Seed Rape. But before all the excitement starts, it is every farmer's least favourite job that needs to be done first. All the grain stores need to be cleaned. Which is a very dusty job but must be done to ensure that there is no contamination, either from previous crops or bugs and mites that may have found their way into the stores over winter. We use an industrial sized air compressor and vacuum cleaner for this. It doesn't take very long usually and will all be done in a couple of days, at least this year the weather is slightly cooler, so it is marginally more bearable.

We also have been giving all the machinery a quick once over to check everything is all mechanically sound and ready for the busy months ahead, as a breakdown on a nice sunny day can be quite frustrating, especially if it's going to rain the next day!

It sounds odd as we haven't started this year's harvest yet, but planning for next year's harvest has already started. Our cropping plan is in place, making sure that there is a good rotation of crops to prevent any soil disease, which can happen if the same crop is grown year after year in the same field. We are planning to plant our Oil Seed Rape (OSR) in early August so in reality it's not that far away! All weather dependent of course. We will be utilising some of the by-product from Herriard AD plant in the form of digestate as well. This will help to get the OSR off to a good start and away from pests like pigeons and flea beetles. Also, we will be trialing a new method of 'companion cropping'. We will plant 2 types of clover (Crimson & Berseem). These will grow underneath the canopy of the OSR, as well as a crop called buckwheat, this will grow

away quickly but killed off by a frost. Which hopefully is when the OSR is a larger, stronger plant. Our grain drill (planter) has the capabilities to plant all of these in one pass, so it saves us having to drill them all separately. The idea is that the buckwheat grows quickly to help disguise the OSR from pests. The clovers have different properties which will complement the OSR as well. The idea is that a multi species crop will support a wider network of soil biodiversity which will aid the main crop that we are trying to grow. There are more and more of these trials going on in the commercial arable farming world and I'm looking forward to seeing more of it and potentially implementing it into our farming system.

The chicken are laying well and enjoying the grass field that their mobile house is sat in. This means we can move their house around the grass to make sure they don't over trample/eat the pasture too harshly. These hens are just about to finish their productive laying cycle and egg numbers will start to drop off in due course. So, these hens will soon be heading off farm and over to a re-homing company. We will then have a full deep clean of the house and make sure everything is disinfected, ready for the new hens to arrive at a nice clean house.

As always, we thank all the locals for your patience during the harvest period. It can be very stressful, and we appreciate your understanding. It is our results day and hopefully all our efforts over the past year will be worthwhile.

Here is a list of the birds it identified in those 20 minutes or so: Wren, Blue Tit, Sparrow, Collared-Dove, Great Tit, Nuthatch, Starling, Greenfinch, Wood-Pigeon, Robin, Goldcrest, Firecrest, Jackdaw, Swallow and a Long-Tailed Tit. We have many beautiful trees around the churchyard so it's a great habitat for birds but we had not expected this!

Next on our list is a survey of what's growing in the churchyard. Watch this space - and we hope this has inspired you to find out what birds you can hear from your back door step!

Nature's best nests - the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust

When we picture a bird's nest, we tend to think of a bundle of twigs high up in a tree. In most cases this is fairly accurate, but some species are much more inventive. If no suitable trees are available, birds can find alternative accommodation in the strangest of places.

Shelducks, long-tailed tits, cuckoos and goldeneyes are four brilliant nest builders with unconventional but effective approaches to homemaking.

Very few people see shelduck nests because they are usually underground in rabbit burrows! The female lines the floor of the burrow with plants and fluffy down feathers to make it cosy before laying her eggs, and the male stays close at hand to escort his partner on feeding trips. Hampshire and Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust nature reserves around Portsmouth are ideal places to spot shelducks as they are mainly found in coastal areas.

Long-tailed tit nests are masterpieces of engineering. They are like big, oval bubbles of moss, hair, spiderwebs and lichen, with a single hole to squeeze in and out of. The male and female build the nest together - a process which can take over three weeks. They usually lay six to eight eggs but can produce as many as 15! Luckily the nest is stretchy and can expand to accommodate the growing chicks.

Cuckoos don't need to build nests - instead, they sneak their eggs into the nests of other birds. When the rightful owner leaves her nest, the female cuckoo races in and lays an egg of her own, and when the cuckoo chick hatches, it pushes out the other eggs or chicks. This way, when the unsuspecting mother bird comes back with a beak full of goodies, the cuckoo chick can take all the food for itself.

Tree nesting might not seem odd for a bird, but how often do you see a duck perched on a branch? Goldeneyes are dainty diving ducks that lay their eggs in tree cavities. They line the nest with feathers to make it nice and comfortable, but when the ducklings are just a day old, they have to jump out to follow their mum to water.

Of course, lots of our feathered friends make their nests in hedges as they provide a good form of safety for eggs and chicks from predators. Whilst it is not illegal to trim garden hedges during the peak nesting season, it is a criminal offence to damage or destroy the nest of any wild bird while it is in use or being built. The Hampshire and Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust advises to avoid cutting hedgerows from March – September and to delay any maintenance work till January or February,

as winter and autumn berries provide a valuable food source for birds like redwings, blackbirds and fieldfares.


