Letter from the Benefice Ministry Team

Mr Bates versus the Post Office

For many of you this will be your first Parish Magazine of 2024, so on behalf of the ministry team may I wish you all a very Happy New Year.

For a number of Sundays last autumn our congregations around the Benefice were invited to reflect on how we might live out our lives as Christians, not just on Sunday



mornings in church but also from Monday to Saturday, wherever we are, whatever we do, whoever we are. Our time together as a Christian community on a Sunday morning, as we pray, sing, listen to and reflect on scripture, is vitally important for our nourishment and growth as disciples of Christ. Equally important is how we live that out once we leave church and go back into the communities in which we live.

The Church of England has '5 Marks of Mission', developed as a way of understanding what contemporary mission is about. One of them is: 'To respond to human need by loving service'. In recent times there have been numerous instances of us all coming together as community to support the needs of others: welcoming into our villages our Ukrainian friends, setting up the Foodbank in Odiham, setting up the Book Exchange when the library closed, inviting people to share in a hot meal twice a month in North Warnborough Village Hall, and so much more. Whether the lead is taken by the church or by other groups in the community, we come together to respond to human need.

Another of the '5 Marks of Mission' is 'To seek to transform unjust structures of society, to challenge violence of every kind and to pursue peace and reconciliation'. As we all took down our Christmas trees and decorations many of us will have watched the TV programme *Mr Bates versus the Post Office*. I counted at least four people that I know personally represented on screen, and that will be true for many of you too. If ever there was an 'unjust structure of society' which merited transformation, it is these events, stretching over 20 years when 700 or more sub-postmasters and mistresses were prosecuted by the Post Office for false accounting and theft.

In some instances, what added to the distress for those concerned was the reaction of their local community. There was little time over four episodes to reflect the reaction countrywide, although a clear impression was presented of both positive and negative extremes. James Arbuthnot was our MP at the time and he took up the cause of Jo at South Warnborough. Jo was supported by a forensic accountant, resident in our Benefice. The then Vicar of St Andrew's church, just across the road from the shop and Post Office, went to court in Winchester to give a passionate character reference, accompanied by so many people from the village that the judge passed comment on the level of support for Jo. What was not covered in the drama series was the massive support, practical and emotional, given to Jo at the time by the people of South Warnborough who were doing what they could about this unfair and unjust situation.

This was a real example of a community in action, and indeed the whole campaign spearheaded by Mr Bates represents the power of community action in terms of commitment, participation, use of skills and talents, and love and kindness to others. It has taken far too long to resolve this miscarriage of justice which had such devastating consequences for so many. Happily the TV dramatisation seems to have catapulted this to front of mind of those who have the power to put right the injustices, and we can hope now that the right thing will be done in a short timeframe. Sadly there are some who are no longer here to be compensated but hopefully their families will have the satisfaction of hearing the good names of their loved ones restored.

Jesus said 'Love God' and 'Love your neighbour as yourself'. May 2024 be the year in which the neighbours in Ukraine and Russia, and the neighbours in Israel and Palestine, find a way to live alongside one another in peace. May 2024 be a year when our communities continue to come together to 'respond to human need by loving service' and 'to pursue peace and reconciliation'.

NEWS FROM THE VILLAGES

Farming news

As we kick off 2024, the weather seems to have given us a break for the moment, 'Touch wood!' It won't be long until we are back out in the fields tending to the crops. But first we have 'red tape season' which is always fun...! This will be filling out and completing all the relevant documents and forms to show that we comply with all the regulations that meet 'red tractor' standards which you may recognise. The red tractor logo, on food packaging in the supermarkets, shows you as the consumer that the standards set out by red tractor have been met and the product is to the highest standard.

For us, as arable farmers, we will provide the records of how we grow our crops, which include what fertiliser we have applied, what crop protection fungicides have been applied as well as herbicides. We will also have to show that the machinery we use for these applications is up to standard and has passed its annual checks, much like an MOT for your car, we will also show how we store our grain.

It does go into quite a lot more depth, but I think I might bore you. It is largely common sense, but you must record that you are using common sense when carrying out our job. Having said this, I do agree with the standard, as this sets us apart from the rest of the world. The standards that British farmers produce food to is second to none, and it is something we are extremely proud of, but obviously this all comes at a price, which makes it very hard for us to compete with the price of lower standard produce. Hence, why a lot of farmers are diversifying their businesses to help subsidise food production.

The farming industry is like no other in the sense that we are price takers. We get told what we must pay for our inputs such as seed, fertiliser and sprays, but also we get told what we are going to get paid for our produce at the end. Now there are a few tactics that we can use, such as buying groups to help with purchasing inputs, also selling our grain through companies that trade in larger quantities of grain or syndicate grain stores, which can help to achieve better prices. After the last couple of years, not much could protect us from the volatility that we have seen around the world, and I know it's not just farmers suffering from that either, so let's hope to see some 'normality', whatever that is, for 2024.

The chickens are also enjoying the drier weather, giving them a chance to roam the field without getting soaked. Thankfully there hasn't been a resurgence of avian flu this winter, which is great, allowing them to roam freely all winter.

This dry weather is starting to give me itchy feet though, especially after the mayhem of Christmas and New Year's celebrations. We will hopefully be able to spread some fertiliser by mid-February, and hopefully we can start thinking about planting our barley later that month, weather-dependent of course. So, I will finish this month's piece just as Joe finished his. Hoping for an even balance of sun and rain this coming year.

News from the Hospital

Well, it looks like the cynics who predicted we would never get a new hospital in North Hampshire are about to be proved wrong. Already the funds for construction have been allocated by the Treasury, based on a programme which has wide multi political party support. Now the public consultation has started. Normally such a consultation would last 12 weeks, but with the dead period of Christmas it was decided to make it 14, ending on Sunday 17th March.

So, what are the options being proposed for us to consider? Under all the schemes, there will be significant investment in the hospital at Winchester, however currently the A&E department will change to an Urgent Treatment Centre (UTC). Whilst, at first, that might for most people seem a serious loss, these departments are designed to be able to deal with most non-life-threatening conditions, including items like broken bones. Then there would be a centralised advanced and specialist high trauma/accident centre sited in the new hospital, which would suggest a real gain; after all, in such emergencies naturally we all want the fastest and best treatment.

Now let us consider the three options being put forward for consultation, which of course are in addition to the refurbishment at Winchester.

Option 1

This is estimated to be the most expensive and difficult to undertake, as it involves re-development of the current site at Basingstoke. The site is already restricted, with little scope for the option to develop a health campus alongside it. Such a campus could have a long-term impact for local employment and investment. Projects of this nature are a project manager's nightmare, with constrictions of space, whilst not interfering with current operations. However, it does have the benefit of good local public transport, which will be increasingly important as the local population ages and becomes less capable in using private transport.

Option 2

A completely new hospital close to junction 7 of the M3, this of course being a greenfield site would be the easiest to build, and it would involve purchasing enough land for future expansion, as well as offering space for a health campus alongside. For those using their own transport it might well be best, but for those reliant on public transport especially from more distant locations and with any mobility issues, access could well be problematic. At the same time, outpatients, some therapies and

day care patients would continue to be treated on the present much reduced existing Basingstoke site.

Option 3

As for Option 2 but with the added benefit of a sixty-bed drop-down care facility. Whilst more expensive than option 2, as more refurbishments would be required to the existing facilities in Basingstoke, it is cheaper than Option 1. It is also less attractive in operating costs but obviously has the big advantage that in the event of the need in the future to create a major isolation area, using this facility would be much easier and quicker to establish. It is to be expected that we will have more pandemics in the future as we continue to travel more and live more closely together.

A major change that has already taken place has been to centralise much of the elective surgery into the Winchester hospital. The objectives here are to have a concentration of expertise, and to have dedicated theatres for these operations, which would not have disrupted schedules due to emergency surgery taking precedence. However, for those relying on public transport, either to attend themselves or to visit a patient, major issues are already coming to the fore. At the same time parking and access through the city have always been problematic.

Other options have had to be ruled out either as too expensive, lack of land, or access and transport. Not only does the consultation document give details of the options but it also gives details of various events being held, at which local people can gain more insight and feedback their own observations. In addition, the document contains a link for feedback, with all comments and observations being treated as anonymous. These comments, on completion of the consultation period, will then be collated by an independent research company and fed back to the Trust for incorporation into the new hospital plan.

The mill buildings were the original location of Portals who first sold bank note paper to the Bank of England from the mill in 1724 and there are interesting industrial and agricultural archaeological remains, including reconstructed water meadow structures.

Hampshire and IoW Wildlife Trust - Is it a waxwing winter?

The waxwing is an undeniably beautiful bird. It's a touch smaller than a starling, with a pleasingly plump body. Its silky feathers are soft hues of grey, brown and apricot, with some stylish accessories. There's a bright yellow band across the end of the tail, white and yellow dashes on the wings, and a black patch on the throat and above the beak, which sweeps back through the eye and up, like the perfect winged eyeliner.

Waxwings are winter visitors, travelling here from Scandinavia when the food supply there runs low, typically residing here until early spring. Another big part of their appeal is that their arrival is never guaranteed. Some winters, we might only see a handful across the country. In others, there can be flocks of hundreds of birds. An influx like this is called an 'irruption'. These years are known as 'waxwing winters' and they don't come around very often.

It all comes down to berries. Waxwings love them. Poor berry crops in Finland and Sweden have apparently pushed waxwings much further than usual this year, and with a berry bonanza reported across the country this autumn, Britain looks set to enjoy its biggest 'Waxwing winter' for at least a decade.

In Hampshire, waxwings are not seen every year, they are a rare visitor. One of the largest irruptions in Hampshire was in the winter of 2010 when over 2,000 birds arrived. However, when they do turn up, it might not be where you'd expect.

One of the waxwing's endearing quirks is that they regularly turn up in urban areas, particularly the car parks of supermarkets and shopping centres. These commercial areas are often planted with ornamental trees with aesthetically pleasing, berry-laden fruit trees – and these always prove popular with hungry waxwings.

But it seems not all berries are equal in the eyes of a waxwing. Red ones appear to be the most in-demand, including cotoneaster, viburnum, hawthorn and particularly rowan. As stocks of these are depleted, they'll settle for orange or yellow berries, or white berries like mistletoe.

Waxwings are chatty and their pleasant high-pitched trills, which they use to call to each other with, provide one of the best ways to help detect them. Fittingly for a winter visitor, the sound is often likened to soft, jingling sleigh bells.
