Letter from the Benefice Ministry Team

900 Years of Faith: A Reflection from St Nicholas, Newnham

St Nicholas Church in Newnham has been a place of worship for at least 900 years. With a Norman arch dating to around 1125, and possible Saxon roots even earlier, the church has been a sacred constant in the life of this village for centuries. People have been baptized, married, buried here – generation after generation witnessing to the enduring importance of faith in community life.



As part of our Newnham 900 celebrations, we've explored the Church's role across history – from the Norman conquest to the Civil War. Throughout these periods, the Church wasn't just a building – it was the heart of life. Faith shaped how people lived, thought, and related to one another. It was central and essential.

Of course, the Church has had its failures, including one Hampshire example in the Civil War where horses were slaughtered and stacked to block attacking troops and more recently with the failing of the institutional church to recognise and act upon abuse, abandoning the most vulnerable.

But the Church has always stood as a place of sanctuary too – symbolised by Winchester Cathedral's shattered stained-glass window, later reassembled into a beautiful mosaic. Like our lives, faith holds together the broken pieces and transforms them into something meaningful.

So why, after 900 years of relevance, has the Church become unimportant to many? Often, it's a question of proof. People say "I can't see God, so I can't believe". But belief in unseen things is not unusual. We accept the existence of atoms, bacteria, red blood cells, and distant galaxies without ever seeing them ourselves. We trust the testimony of those who've studied and recorded them.

The Christian faith is built on similar testimony. The Gospels provide eyewitness accounts of Jesus' life and ministry recorded by his disciples. These are not second-hand myths but the reflections of those

who walked beside him. And many lives have been changed by this witness.

Science and faith are not enemies. Faith isn't a rejection of intellect – it's a decision to trust evidence passed down by those who have seen and known.

Today, the Church is not a rich institution. It's more like the NHS: under pressure, overstretched, and trying its best with limited resources. Many ministers serve without pay, or with housing alone. Our rural churches are struggling, not because faith is less real, but because regular attendance and support have faded. If local churches are to survive, they need more than money – they need people to come, to commit, and to believe.

In a world full of uncertainty - political unrest, war, division – faith remains one of the few things that offers something solid. God's love is constant. Worship reminds us of eternity, of purpose, and of the deep truth that we are loved.

We are invited into relationship with God – not through pressure, but through love – in, with and alongside Jesus Christ; part of a Christ-centred heritage leading to a Christ-centred future...

So if you've ever dismissed faith as outdated, think again. Nine hundred years of Christian belief in Newnham tells us this isn't a passing trend.

It's something deep, real, and life-changing.

Come and see. Come and believe. Come and be changed.

Amen.

Recently I went walking in the Forest of Bere for the first time. At the entrance of one of the walking tracks was a sign with the heading: Forest for Wellbeing. I read on. 'Spending time among trees and really noticing nature, is scientifically proven to help us boost our physical and mental health.' Along the track I found a number of

other signs and panels that encouraged me to stop and pay attention to what was around me. By the end of the walk, I found that I felt a little bit lighter and more calm and steady in myself.

Christian tradition teaches us that God is always calling us into the present moment. We can so easily get lost in our regrets of the past and our worries about the future, but right here and right now is the only moment that truly matters. This is what prayer is for; connecting with God and with ourselves in the here and now, and allowing space for God's life and love to come through into the present.

As we enjoy the summer and get out and about, I really encourage you to take some time, either by yourself or with the people you are with, to slow down and pay attention to what's around you – to connect with nature, yourself and with God. Here's a simple idea that I found on the walk at Forest of Bere which you might like to use:

As you walk take time to notice:

5 things that you can see....

4 things you can touch...

3 things you can hear...

2 things you can smell...

1 thing you can taste.

This type of practice is not just good for our physical and mental health, but it is good for our emotional and spiritual wellbeing as well.

So, what things will you do this summer that will help to nurture your whole self and connect you with the things that matter most?

NEWS FROM THE VILLAGES

Farming News

I'm sitting here with a pint in hand at the 'Twice Brewed Inn' (brewing beer since the mid-1700s so the sign says) looking out across the Northumbrian countryside towards Hadrian's Wall atop Winshield Craggs. I'm spending four nights in different hostelries walking west to east along the wall from Brampton to Chollerford with Claire and two of her cousins. Discovering more of the history of Hadrian's wall and the Roman occupation since AD43 has been fascinating and the scenery suitably epic. I've been as interested in the local farming, historically as well as present day, in this harsh landscape. We did hold a gate open between the patchwork of stone-walled fields for a shepherd on his quad bike today, who was guiding his sheep to fresh pasture with the help of two very well trained Border Collies. It's a joy to see these working dogs in action although we received a fairly gruff 'thanks' from the shepherd as I'm sure he was thinking 'blooming tourists, I can cope on my own'.

It makes me realise how lucky we are farming in Hampshire with our many acres of workable soil in large, manageable fields. With three days walking behind us we've only seen beef and sheep farming with one solitary dairy farm along the way, and no arable crops whatsoever. The boggy, stony, steep fields don't lend themselves to cultivation. In fact, today we crossed some medieval 'ridge and furrow' fields that had been ploughed centuries ago but have now been beautifully preserved because being unproductive, they had long ago reverted to grass. The stocking rates of cattle and sheep per acre are very low because of the sparse grass swards and consequently the farmers' returns will be minimal. It is a harsh environment in all senses.

We noticed that many of the farm buildings we passed were built using 'locally sourced' finely crafted Roman granite. One of the few upsides of farming near the wall is that it has been supplying farmers with free building materials for the last two millennia. It's been a fascinating few days and if you enjoy hiking then I'd highly recommend this middle section.

'Ash before oak: in for a soak. Oak before ash: in for a splash' as grandad used to say. This year our oak trees were definitely out in leaf before the ash trees on the farm and the saying has held true so far. A splash of rain sums up all we have had this spring. June 3rd was the first significant rainfall we recorded on the farm since late February. Finally, though, April showers in June! The consequences of this prolonged dry

spell will only become clear when the combines roll into our wheat this August and the forager harvests our maize in September.

Already, though, our grass yields have been much lower than usual for grazed grass and for the two cuts of silage we have made so far, purely due to lack of water. A farming friend sold his herd of cows in March with the plan of moving to New Zealand to start again over there. He had some of last year's grass silage left over in his silage clamps so we bought that from him to bolster our own stocks. At the time I wasn't sure if it was the right move but I'm very glad I did now as we'll need all the forage we can get to feed our cows and heifers through this coming winter.

There are at least four dairy herds going out of production in Hampshire that I know of this year. Chris, our milk recorder (we take individual milk samples from each cow every month to record her individual milk quality) was telling me that when she started in the job in the 1970s there were 20 dairy herds in her patch which was within a 12-mile radius of Preston Candover. Now we will be the only one. One dairy farm has apparently been bought by a French vineyard. A sign that our landscape continues to evolve as it has done for thousands of years.

Donations can be made on a monthly, quarterly or annual basis, using a Direct Debit instruction. Even though donations are made to the Parish Giving Scheme, they are restricted to our parish, and the PGS claims the eligible gift aid element immediately which comes back into the PCC bank account as soon as it is received from HMRC. There is also a voluntary decision to increase your gift annually in line with inflation.

Please do consider the Parish Giving Scheme – it is secure, confidential and easy to use, supporting our church today and for the future. There are two ways to sign up to the scheme:

North Hampshire National Trust Centre

Hever Castle in Kent was the destination of the NHNTC outing on 22nd May – and what an outing! Our driver, Nick of Farnham Coaches, had a hard journey, made the more difficult by the long queues of cars on the M25 (beware the interception with the A3) and the narrow, winding roads of rural Kent. Once at Hever we had the run of the place for 4½ hours – hardly long enough, though, to take in all the wonders of this treasure trove of memories of our past monarchs and English aristocracy.

With thunder forecast for later in the afternoon, most of us headed for the magnificent gardens with their waterways, lake and extensive lawns, bordered by spectacular displays of seasonal flowers and shrubs. The yew maze was not too challenging but the water maze, with its hidden water-spout switches hidden in the stepping stones, allowed few to escape without a few splashes, if not a soaking.

The afternoon was spent learning the story of the castle itself and touring round its magnificent and beautifully restored rooms. These have been set up to cover the history and lifestyles of the various families who had called it home.

Hever was built in 1270 with a massive gatehouse and walled Bailey, surrounded by a moat and approached over a wooden drawbridge. In the 15th and 16th centuries, the castle was improved and gentrified by Thomas Bullen whose granddaughters, Mary and Anne Boleyn, became in turn mistress and second wife of Henry VIII. Later the castle became the home of Henry's third wife, Ann of Cleves, by then the ex-Queen.

More history was to follow in the persons of the Astor family who acquired the estate in the 20th century and further developed the castle and surrounding lands, bringing it to the memorable visit it is today.

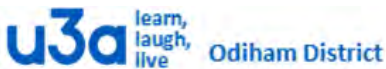

Adder's-tongue among the grasses

As summer unfolds, Hampshire's meadows come alive with a tapestry of flora. Among these is the elusive adder's-tongue fern (*Ophioglossum vulgatum*), a plant that, despite its modest appearance, boasts a remarkable natural history.

Belonging to one of the oldest lineages of ferns, the adder's-tongue is often termed a 'living fossil.' Its name derives from the distinctive spore-bearing spike that protrudes from its singular, tongue-shaped leaf, resembling a snake's tongue. This unique structure sets it apart from more familiar fern species.



Much of the adder's-tongue's life is spent beneath the soil as a rhizome. Its underground phase relies on a symbiotic relationship with mycorrhizal fungi, which provide essential nutrients. This subterranean lifestyle allows the fern to persist for years without producing above-ground leaves, emerging only when conditions are favourable.

Remarkably, the adder's-tongue fern holds the record for the highest number of chromosomes among known plants. While humans have 46 chromosomes, some species genus possess up to 1,260

chromosomes, highlighting its unique genetic makeup.

Adder's-tongue has also held a special place in human history and culture. In the past, it was believed to have magical properties, with some people carrying a piece of the plant to protect against snake bites. It was also used in traditional medicine to treat wounds and inflammation.

There are two other closely related plants, the small adder's-tongue fern and the least adder's-tongue fern, both of which are much smaller and rarer, and are only found at a few sites around the south-west of England.

In Hampshire, adder's-tongue thrives in ancient, unimproved grasslands and meadows – areas untouched by modern agriculture. Management practices, including careful grazing and habitat restoration, support the delicate ecosystems that these ancient ferns depend upon. Hampshire and Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust plays a pivotal role in preserving these habitats, ensuring that species like the adder's-tongue continue to flourish.

Adder's-tongue ferns typically appear in late spring and early summer, so now is the perfect time to keep an eye out for them. The fern is unusual as, along with growing on grasslands and meadows, it also grows on hillsides, along woodland rides and on sand dunes. It can typically be found alongside common spotted-orchids, quaking grass and devil's-bit scabious.

It is considered a good indicator species of ancient meadows. Their presence is a sign of ancient, undisturbed grasslands – an encouraging reminder of the richness and resilience of Hampshire's natural heritage.
