Letter from the Benefice Ministry Team How odd is your Vicar?

An important and satisfying question to ask, I think. The Church of England has a rich history of decidedly odd clergy. Some of whom were odd in a 'that's quite quaint' sort of way and others who were odd



in a manner that bordered on criminal or requiring medical intervention. The country Parson is part of the broader tradition of English eccentricity and the desire to disrupt a culture bound by complex rules, or perhaps the desire to find something to do amidst the perpetual drizzle.

Take for example the Rev Robert Hawker. Rev Hawker (1803-1875) had a dual calling to be both a Priest and a mermaid. Never one to neglect his calling(s), however unlikely, he fashioned a wig out of seaweed, wrapped an oilskin around his legs and then, every evening, rowed a boat out into Bude harbour where he sat on a rock and sang.

This unusual behaviour continued for a time until eventually, perhaps out of boredom or due to the increasingly cold weather, Rev Hawker substituted his mermaid song for a stirring rendition of the national anthem, jumped into the water and swam back home.

Having completed his Curacy in Bude, the aquatic clergyman took up the Incumbency of Morwenstow where, devoid of supervision, he could indulge his eccentricity to his heart's content. Although no longer wearing seaweed wigs, the Vicar was often spotted wearing a bright purple coat, a blue fisherman's jersey and red trousers. He lived with a collection of ten cats who would follow him into church, until one Sunday one of his feline housemates was publicly ex-communicated for mousing on the Sabbath. If you happen to go to Morwenstow today you can still visit 'Hawker's Hut' – the smallest property owned by the National Trust and built by Rev Robert Hawker, a national treasure.

Or we might look to the Rev Thomas Patten, who also combined two vocations, as a Priest and a smuggler. Vicar of Seasalter near Whistable, Patten was famous for preaching incredibly long sermons which would only end when a member of the congregation offered to buy him drinks in the local pub – at which point he would speak a rushed Blessing, leave the pulpit and head to the bar. Not content with extorting booze from his parishioners, Patten became an informer for a group of local smugglers, who in return for information about the whereabouts of

the local authorities would keep his Vicarage well stocked in fine wine, brandy and contraband tobacco. After 53 years as Vicar of the parish, Patten died, and a memorial to him exists in the church to this day.

Now as I look around the team of clergy and lay readers who support the ministry of the North Hampshire Downs Benefice I am relieved to say that none of us think we are mermaids, preach to cats or are members of local smuggling rackets. We are all, however, from different backgrounds and come with different experiences of life. We are united by a desire to love our remarkable local communities and build up the life of our churches so that increasingly our lives radiate with the love and grace of God.

All of this brings me to an observation, namely this: that God calls the most surprising and varied bunch of people to ministry of all shapes and sizes and that there is no-one that God cannot use in his service. Even the 'rough diamonds' and the outright oddities find a new home in God and a place in which fulfilment in calling can be found. Our two odd clergy noted above were certainly unusual, but, despite their eccentricities and proclivity for illegal importing of goods, they were loved by their parishioners. Probably I suspect because the clergy in question loved them too.

NEWS FROM THE VILLAGES

Farming News

Spring has sprung finally and as I write this, I can see that the Swallows and the House Martins are enjoying the sunshine after making the long journey from South Africa where they spend our winter months. It's always great to see them around and is a sure sign that summer is on the way.

Spring is my favourite time of year, more so this year after the long winter we have had. It is at this time of year that the crops that were planted in the autumn, start to grow again and the spring sown crops are growing away nicely. The fields around the farm have been changing from the colour of soil/mud to different shades of green and it is very satisfying.

Considering the extremely wet winter we've had, the crops have fared well and are responding to the fertiliser that we have been steadily feeding them. This also means that as they grow, we must apply protection for the crops from soil and airborne diseases. We do this in the form of fungicides. This is sprayed on and gives the leaf a layer of protection to prevent these diseases from penetrating the plant. Our aim is to keep the crops as green as possible for as long as possible, which allows the crops to photosynthesize for as long as possible. The longer the crop can photosynthesize, the higher the yield potential will be.

We can see the effect of the fertilisers and sprays on the corners of the field where they haven't been applied. The crops are yellow and stunted where the crops have been malnourished and not protected. Now I know there are movements for a reduction in both fertilisers and sprays within the farming industry, which I am fully for, as it means less expensive inputs for us, but we must be careful not to jump on the band wagon of reducing our inputs to levels which affect our yields. At the end of the day there is a growing population that needs feeding and we certainly won't be able to do that by being organic. To put into perspective, half of the world's food is grown using fertiliser. We saw what food shortages looked like during the Covid pandemic; it is not something we want to see again.

Having said this there are a lot of new technology coming through to help us manage our crops better. For example, both our fertiliser spreader and sprayer are driven using GPS. So, the machine knows exactly where it is in the field and turns itself on and off when required to minimise overlaps. We also use satellite imagery that will zone fields into areas of better or poorer zones. We will then load this onto the tractor's computer, and we can apply fertiliser only where required on our fields. We also grow modern varieties of crops that are resistant to some diseases meaning we spray less.

I will compare a variety of wheat to a breed of dog, bear with me on this one. A dog is the species, but the breeds vary quite a lot within the species. A Chihuahua is a very different dog to a Great Dane. Much the same as a variety of wheat that can provide different 'properties' to one another. So, we grow varieties that will best suit us, ones that can fend off diseases but provide quality for milling into flour for bread. This is down to the plant breeders to keep evolving and providing varieties of crops that are less reliant on crop protection whilst still providing us with enough yield to feed our population. There is a happy medium in my opinion where we can take the best 'tools' from our industry to grow food as efficiently as possible.

One trial I have on the go this year is in one of our fields. I have planted four different varieties together. They are all varieties that will be of milling quality but they all have different levels of resistance against disease. The aim is that being grown together the more resistant varieties will help the ones that aren't. We won't know until it has been harvested to see if this has worked and fingers crossed it makes milling quality.

I have just finished watching the latest series of 'Clarkson's Farm'. It has been a brilliant watch and would highly recommend it. Like him or not, he shows off very well the ups and downs of farming with a twist of entertainment sprinkled on top. The great thing is that he can afford to show off the struggle without it financially hurting him unlike other farmers.

On the farm we will be in harvest preparations soon. The combine is being serviced and checked over by John Deere this week and that has made me think we need to get cracking with our other machines. Unfortunately, this also means the pesky job of cleaning grain stores is looming!

Three Peaks Challenge to support Long Sutton School

A group of nine local mums of students and ex-students of Long Sutton Primary school are planning to do the National Three Peaks challenge on the 22nd June to help raise funds for our lovely village school. The shop also has a good selection of fresh fruit and vegetables, groceries, fresh bread, Cook ready meals, cheese, cold meats, cookery and household items, wine, beer, newspapers and magazines and many other things. If you have not been in the shop before, please give it a try.

There are many villagers who do not use the shop at all and many who only use it to buy one item a week! Obviously, this cannot continue if the shop is to survive. It is very important to me and others who use the shop that this facility is maintained. Please try and make a visit and use the shop as regularly as you can. It would be a huge loss to the village and the community as a whole if the shop were to close.



National Gardens Scheme – Hampshire

Asian Hornets: I wrote an article on these pests a few years ago. The problem is not going away. As gardeners we should be very aware of this invasive species and the harm they can do to our wildlife, and what we should do if we come across one. Asian Hornets are destructive to Honey Bees with one being able to destroy 60 of our native bees a day. The number

of confirmed nests has increased significantly over the last few years, especial in Kent and the Southern Counties. To read the full report on this simply go the NGS website - ngs.org.uk - then click on Lifestyle and page down to the article on Asian Hornets. The more people who are aware of this problem the better chance we have of at least decreasing the numbers. Doing nothing should not be an option. To this end, please pass this information on to all your and family and friends.
