From the Benefice Ministry Team

Jeremy Paxman in his book 'The English – A Portrait of a People' described the English as doers rather than thinkers:

'Once upon a time the English knew who they were... They were polite, unexcitable, reserved, had hot water bottles instead of a sex life: How they reproduced was one of the wonders of the modern world. They were doers rather than thinkers, writers rather than painters, gardeners rather than cooks...'



For myself I recognise that I always want to do things. I like to get things done! Unlike the Scots, the English rarely want to grapple with philosophy or complex ideological ideas – we tend to be concerned with making things work – or making them work better. Particularly if we have a farm or a school or a hospital or a business to run.

And yet, once in a while, my attention is grabbed by a philosophical concept or writer. A few years ago a friend introduced me to the work of the Danish theologian/philosopher Søren Kierkegaard (1813-1855). One of his ideas caught my notice:

'Life can only be understood backwards; but it must be lived forwards.'

Lent is a moment in the year when we do exactly that. We continue to live life forward in anticipation of the joy of Easter, but we also spend time in reflection looking back on the life we have lived and the way we have lived it.

How is 2023 unfolding for you? How have the past few year been for you? Have they been good? Difficult? Non-years? Have you felt able to rise to the challenges of Covid? Felt empowered to play your part in the world? Or have you felt that you have just been a spectator or a victim – merely reacting to events – positive and negative?

Lent is a moment in the year when we have the opportunity to look back on life and to begin to make sense of it. How is your Lent going so far? Even if you feel that so far Lent 2023 has passed you by, it is never too late to start.

For a good number of years I have managed to spend some time in retreat. Some years my retreat can last a few days. Other years it is just a day. Other years it is just a morning. I take my Bible and a pile of books.

I read and write and I pray. Weather permitting, I love to go on long walks as I reflect on the events of the last year. I always return home from every retreat refreshed, re-energised, and with lessons from the past to help me live more wholly in the future.

In the busyness of life, taking stock – looking back – can feel like something of a luxury. And yet time spent during Lent understanding life backwards is actually an investment in living life forwards. How might you make some space this Lent to look backwards? A few hours spent alone at home or away or walking in a favourite place might just make all the difference. A few hours spent alone reflecting on the past might just reveal the very important lessons you need to live life more wholly in the future. Or join one of our lent groups. Why not mark out some time in your diary right now? With love and prayers.

NEWS FROM THE VILLAGES

March Farming News

We have a dreaded farm inspection this afternoon, one of many each year. I'll let you know how we got on at the end of this article. This audit is by our milk buyer, Arla, and is focused on animal welfare. The inspector will go through all our cattle medical records, medicine inventory, foot scoring charts (we regularly foot score every cow to spot lameness), body scoring data (are our cows too fat? Too thin?), visual appraisal of cattle housing, feed store, general cleanliness and much, much more...

In many ways it's a very good thing because it makes us look at our cattle and farm as a whole with fresh eyes. It also helps Arla go to their customers; you, me, the supermarkets and prove that their milk and dairy products are produced to the highest animal welfare standards of any country in the world.

We do get an awful lot of inspections though. As well as the Arla audit above, we have: -

- Red Tractor, Assured Combinable Crops for our arable, which check fertiliser and spray applications, corn storage, soil quality and everything associated with our crop production.
- Red Tractor, Dairy and Beef which checks medicines, cleanliness, animal welfare, fertiliser and spray application.
- Nitrate Vulnerable Zones for nitrogen and dung application and timings to protect watercourses.
- Basic Payment Scheme to check we are growing what crops we say we are in each particular field.
- Countryside Stewardship to check we are growing our nectar and winter bird food plots in accordance with the scheme rules.

I've probably forgotten a few but you get the picture. You can also see from the above that there is a certain amount of overlap between completely different inspections. It's very frustrating and time consuming to be going over the same things to a different inspector when, if we've conformed to a set of rules for one inspection that should be sufficient for another you'd hope.

Some of these inspections are booked, some are spot checks with no warning. We once had a spot check to make sure all our cows, heifers and calves had ear tags that matched their cattle passports. (Every cow in the UK has a dedicated number for life which you can see on her ear tags and

corresponds to her passport). The inspector was on farm for three days matching every one of our 600 head of stock to their passports. We were all fine but that was three days of my life written off!

The other stress about these inspections is hoping that you get an inspector that actually understands farming. The last Red Tractor dairy inspector we had looked at our milk bulk storage tank and asked me "what do you keep in there?". I knew then that I was in for a very long afternoon! As long as I don't end up doing what one hot headed farmer did and dunked the unfortunate inspector in a water trough because he didn't agree with him. I think that farmer failed his dairy audit.

So home made cake in the dairy office, tea, coffee and clean mugs ready, lip firmly bitten and fingers crossed...

...and relax. Dairy audit over and no inspector was unceremoniously baptised! We passed with only a few minor non-conformances; one tiny hole in the dairy roof, a broken bar on the bottom of a gate and a couple of screws sticking out of a feed trough. That's the level the inspectors burrow into - and they have to find something wrong don't they? We'll rectify those tomorrow. The pleasing thing was, and most importantly, she commented that our animal welfare and dairy hygiene were outstanding. A credit to our team. So, a sigh of relief, a cheeky beer tonight and await the next inspection... Joe Ives

I can picture some lovely weddings, with the bride and groom departing in style in the bucket of a tractor on one occasion, moving Easter services and funerals, and the Queen's Jubilee in 1977. They were happy days, and my son Michael was so upset when told we had to move (my husband had a new job) that he threatened to chain himself to our front door. We shall maintain our historical links with the village; our niece and family live in Herriard, and my grandsons now have school friends here. I hope the new organ is a huge success, and that people will donate generously towards it - by buying the commemorative coat rack.

Luminosa's Spring Concert: Message of Light and Hope: March 25th

Sergei Rachmaninov's *All-Night Vigil* is a haunting cornerstone of the choral repertoire, and an overwhelming listening experience. Altonbased choir, Luminosa, is delighted to be performing this work, along with Morten Lauridsen's *Lux Aeterna*, and Michael Higgins' *O Salutaris Hostia* at All Saints Church, Odiham on Saturday March 25th at 7pm. The *All-Night Vigil* is an incredible work, and arguably Rachmaninov's finest achievement, written within two weeks during the First World War in early 1915. He was looking to write something more introspective than usual: not for liturgical use but as a war benefit concert.

The *All-Night Vigil* asks the congregation to contemplate the light of the coming dawn as emblematic of Christ's resurrection. Rachmaninov followed the church's tradition of basing ten of the fifteen sections on chants, with the remaining five being more free form. In particular, the 'Kiev' chant resonates most poignantly today. The whole work is full of exquisite harmonies, ranging from top soprano to bottom bass, full of light and shade: a radiant masterpiece. The first performance took place in March 1915, when it was warmly received by critics and audiences alike. However, the Russian Revolution of 1917, and the rise of the Soviet Union, led to government condemnation of sacred music. Consequently, no other composition marks the end of an era so completely as this quiet, reflective and deeply moving work.

The concert will also feature Luminosa Chamber Voices who will perform Morten Lauridsen's *Lux Aeterna*. Written in 1997 following the death of his mother, this beautiful work explores music's power to preserve and remember, and the depth of human capacity to love. Lauridsen presents sacred Latin texts in five movements with luminous shifting harmonies, perfectly expressing a timeless sense of serenity. Michael Higgins will provide sensitive, atmospheric piano accompaniment. Luminosa is also honoured to be performing his exquisite *O Salutaris Hostia* (an arrangement of Elgar's *Nimrod*) which he composed during the Covid lockdown.

Conducted by their dynamic artistic director, Rebekah Abbott, Luminosa will perform this exceptional music with the textual variety and sustained luxuriance of sound for which Luminosa is now well known. There will be also a surprise addition to the concert experience which will enhance the evening's message of hope and light.

If you love choral music and appreciate compositions that lift you from the mundane, you should not miss Luminosa's spring concert at the beautiful All Saints Church, Odiham on Saturday March 25th at 7pm. Basingstoke Choral Society Concert: Bach: Saturday 1st April



Early bloomers hint at spring – Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust

As the light creeps slowly back into our evening skies, the very first spring flowers brave the frosty ground, providing the earliest of hints that sunnier days lie ahead.

Perhaps the first floral sign that spring is edging ever closer is the appearance of the humble snowdrop. This elegant little plant may be seen peeping over the frosted soil of woodlands, churchyards or gardens as early as January and can continue to flower until March.

Their dainty (yet deceptively hardy) nodding, pure white flowers have often symbolised innocence, purity and hope. In fact, in Yorkshire, it was customary for village maidens to gather bunches of snowdrops and wear them as a symbol of their purity on February 2nd, which was Candlemas – or otherwise, the feast of the Virgin Mary.

Despite its long history in the UK, however, the snowdrop may not actually be native to our shores; they were not recorded as growing wild here until the late 18th century. Nevertheless, it has certainly become naturalised from garden escapees, and white snowdrop 'valleys' can now be seen across the country.

Another delightful flower that you may find on a late winter walk is the primrose. The name 'primrose' comes from the Latin 'prima rosa', meaning 'first rose'. This is very apt, as this resilient little plant can flower as early as December in mild years. Look out for their pretty, creamyyellow flowers in woodland and grassland habitats.

Primroses are also one of the main foodplants for the caterpillars of the threatened and extremely rare Duke of Burgundy butterfly, which is only found in England.

Since Victorian times, April 19th has been known as 'Primrose Day' in honour of the late Prime Minister Benjamin Disraeli. Primroses were his favourite flowers and they duly grow near his statue in Westminster Abbey and by his grave at Hughenden in Buckinghamshire.

Lesser celandines also bring a welcome splash of sunshine in early spring. Keep an eye out for their bright and buttery blooms growing along hedgerows, in parks and even in graveyards from March through to May. Their happy, star-shaped yellow flowers typically open in the sunlight.

As one of the first spring flowers to bloom, the low-growing lesser celandines provide a valuable nectar source for early insects. Despite its name, lesser celandine is not a close relative of greater celandine – it is actually a member of the buttercup family.


