Maundy Thursday Service of Holy Communion with Tenebrae

The name Maundy Thursday comes from the word mandatum, 'commandment'. In John 13.34 we read that Jesus said to his disciples at the Last Supper: 'I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another.' It contains a rich complex of themes: humble Christian service expressed through Christ's washing of his disciples' feet, the institution of the Eucharist, the perfection of Christ's loving obedience through the agony of Gethsemane.

On Maundy Thursday we will be meeting together in All Saints Church, Odiham at 7.30pm for a quiet and reflective service as we take time to prepare ourselves and to walk with Christ towards the horror of the cross and the joy of Easter Day. Our service will fall into two parts. The first part will be a communion service during which we will recall the institution of the Lord's Supper, and enact Christ's command to 'do this to remember me'.

The second part will be a Tenebrae, which is a service of shadows in which darkness symbolically encroaches as we step closer to Christ's death on Good Friday. The service is structured around nine short readings and after each reading a candle is extinguished, until the church is in darkness, and we leave quietly as we prepare for Good Friday.

Hi everyone!

By the end of this month, it will be Easter – but how does Easter make you feel?

For most of us, Easter is a very happy day, isn't it? It's the day we celebrate Jesus coming back to life after he died on the cross on Good Friday. But it's interesting to think about what Jesus' friends might've been feeling on that day.

I wonder if you've ever played that game, where you've sat opposite someone and they've tried to make you laugh. Maybe you've held out for 30 seconds? Maybe a minute? Maybe you started laughing before they even did anything!
We all know our faces show the way we feel. Sometimes we try to hide it, but we're not always so great at hiding how we feel. Today, I don't want you to hide it! I want you to read this story, and as you do, I want you to doodle faces to show how the people in the story feel about what is happening.

NEWS FROM THE VILLAGES

Farming news

I love this time of year as the days really start drawing out and the birds are in full song long before dawn. We've had a fantastic showing of snowdrops and aconites in the woods and garden here at the dairy. We even had a short spell of dry weather in early February that enabled us to apply slurry to all our grassland. This will give the grass an early boost of growth and save us spreading too much bagged Nitrogen which is not only costly but will increase our carbon footprint. As I've said before, the more of our homemade 'fertiliser' we can use ourselves the better.

It's a joy to finally get out around the fields after winter checking fences and clearing fallen limbs in anticipation of letting the heifers and young stock out to graze sometime in March or early April. By which time the fields should be dry enough and the grass growing. Of course, we have been known to be under a foot of snow then but as Dad always says, "it's not going to last long at this time of year". Last spring was so wet that for the first time ever we didn't roll any of our paddocks, so fingers crossed the weather is kinder this year. Rolling pushes in any stones that the frost has pushed up and ensures good contact between soil and roots. When we mow the fields for silage, we don't want any soil or stone contamination as that will inhibit fermentation in the silage clamp and ultimately limit forage intake for the cows. With that in mind, I've been out setting mole traps as mole hills are a major source of soil contamination. After two weeks of numerous setting and resetting of traps, I've caught the grand total of one! That's a long way off being able to make my own mole skin waistcoat but I shall persevere.

Some other little critters we're having trouble with are mice. Not field mice or dormice which we try and leave habitats for but those house mice you find in your biscuit tin. (Or maybe you don't!). It turns out that the robots we milk the cows with make a very enjoyable adventure playground. When a cow is being milked the robot dispenses feed nuts to her which as she eats, she invariably drops a few morsels at her feet. This is a mouse buffet. They take the morsels into the inner workings of the robot where the circuit boards and motors make for a nice warm dining room. To stop them eyeing up the electric cables and milk lines for dessert we have set several mouse traps in each of the four robots. We have tried various baits and have come to the conclusion that

homemade chocolate cake is their favourite. The dead mice can then provide food for some of their predators.

Talking of which, I read this in the Sunday Papers: "There are now 14,000 breeding pairs of Barn Owls after farmers and landowners helped volunteers put up nest boxes". There were only 12,000 breeding pairs in 1930 and then less in the 1980's as old barns were converted into houses or offices. This is one of many positive initiatives farmers and landowners are involved with when it comes to providing food and protecting the environment.

On that note, you will probably have noticed that European farmers are causing havoc with tractors blocking major roads in France, Italy, Germany and Holland amongst others. 'Farmers are revolting' the news feeds enjoy saying. As I see it, and this is putting it very simplistically, the underlying reason for this is that food has to be cheap and plentiful enough for people to afford it. If it isn't, socially and politically there will be unrest or worse. With all the health & safety and environmental regulations we have when producing food in the UK and Europe, it makes food more expensive than in other parts of the world. It is then obviously tempting for Governments and retailers to allow cheaper alternatives to be imported from countries where standards are nowhere near as high. We're very fortunate in having such a vast choice of food outlets in this country but please check or ask where your food comes from and how it's been grown. Buying avocados, beans or beef that has been grown or reared in a desert halfway around the world will not be the most environmentally or welfare friendly food available.

Sorry, bit of a rant to finish on but, as governments are now finding out, it's all very well making promises but being green and environmentally friendly costs money. Our parishes are in some of the most beautiful countryside anywhere in the world, shaped by centuries of agriculture, forestry and habitation. Long may they stay that way.

National Garden Scheme – Hampshire

PEAT-FREE: You can't fail to have avoided coming across these two words. If, like me, you like to propagate your plants - be it seeds, cuttings or division - I wonder if you have also had the same varying degrees of success using Peat-Free Compost. I know that many gardeners have no problems at all. Maybe I'm in a minority. The January issue of the

RHS magazine *The Garden* had an interesting article entitled *Get Ready to Go PEAT FREE*. The basic points I took from this article are as follows: the main difference seems to be watering and feeding; peat-free is more free-draining, so the nutrients leach out, therefore more regular and earlier feeding is required; treat peat-free compost as part of your growing medium: depending on the use, it should have other matter added - this can be your own garden compost, leaf mould, composted bark, sand and grit, or loam. Happy Planting!

The Hampshire 2024 Yellow Book is now available in all the normal places, but if you have problems getting one of our 2024 County Booklets, please let me know and I can post one to you.

Refreshments: home-made teas. Lord Wandsworth College is set in 1,200 acres of rolling farmland and wooded valleys. The main college campus is set around formal lawns with mature paper bark maples, cedar trees, cherry trees, and magnolias. The herbaceous borders are planted with an array of tulips, daffodils, and alliums. A South African inspired border runs the full length of the new science centre.

An old favourite, which is opening twice in 2024, is:

Old Thatch and Millennium Barn, Spratts Hatch Lane, Winchfield RG27 8DD. Opening Sunday 14th April 2.00pm to 6.00pm. Admission £5.00, children free. Cashless payment available. Refreshments: home-made teas. This chocolate-box thatched cottage has featured on film and TV, and has a smallholding alongside the Basingstoke Canal (unfenced). You can enjoy a succession of spring bulbs, a profusion of wildflowers, perennials and homegrown annuals pollinated by our own bees and fertilised by the donkeys, who await your

visit. There are over 30 named clematis and rose cultivars. Sometimes lambs in April and donkey foals in the summer. Weather permitting, you may get a ride on a John Pinkerton Barge from the car park across from the Barley Mow, along the canal, to the garden.
