Letter from the Benefice Ministry Team

As I write this, the sun is shining bright in the sky, grass is being cut, birds are singing and children are playing out in the park. After a fairly dreary start to the year, it is safe to say that this feels wonderful. It brings a real sense of hope to the world around us, and hope it sorely needs right now.



We have just journeyed through Lent, a time of mourning and reflecting, as we carried the story through the joy of Palm Sunday, the sober reflection of Maundy Thursday, the devastation of Good Friday and finally the celebration of Easter Day. That season is one of the most profound for me, as it takes us through such a breadth of human experience, and carries us in the tough and the joyful.

And here we are now, in the Easter season, following that day. It is a season of hope and promise. It is a season where we are fully aware of the promise of resurrection; of life coming out of death. Of light breaking through the cover of darkness. Of the certainty of Jesus in the confusion of life.

Our world is a fairly uncertain one at the moment. Whether through tariffs, political manoeuvring, environmental crises or all-out war, it is hard sometimes to see the solid ground for the chaos and confusion all around. It would be all too easy in these times to fear, to crumble, to panic. But as a good friend of mine once said to me... 'This is what we've been training for'.

A God who embraced the messiness of humanity and walked with the questions, engaged with the doubting, encountered reality. The message of Easter which we live in today tells us that all will be well... though maybe not as we expect, or when we expect.

The Easter story tells us that Jesus came to equip us, and enable us to engage with life in all its realness. That he invites us to journey with him through the pain, the heartache, the uncertainty. He equips us to live out in precisely the world we find ourselves in today.

His is a real hope, not a false one. A lived, experienced and tested hope. This is what we've been training for... to live confidently today.

Enjoy the sun... whenever we get it!

Join us on Ascension Day!

Have you marked your calendar for Ascension Day on Thursday May 29th?

Please do join us for our beautiful Ascension Day service at 7.30pm that day, in All Saints Church, Odiham. As we look ahead to this important date in the Christian calendar, people often remark that they've not even heard of Ascension Day.

But for hundreds of years, Christians have affirmed Jesus' ascension in the words of the Apostles Creed, as part of which we say:

"....I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead..."

The adjacent picture is of one of the earliest remaining sculpted-panels in ivory, dating right back to AD400. It depicts Jesus' ascension, and underlines how important this event has been to Christians right through the centuries.

Today, the Ascension reminds us that Christianity is not only a historical faith, but a faith of the present and future. For the

present, Jesus is not just our suffering servant who came and died and rose triumphant, but our actively ruling, actively conquering king, who remains active and engaged in our world and our lives.

And as Christians we have this steadfast hope in a glorious future - with him, forever. This is great news... Please come and join us in All Saints Odiham at 7.30pm on Thursday May 29th to find out more!

- Coffee morning at **Weston Patrick Village Hall**, 11.00am-12.30pm on **Wednesday May 28th**.


Tea or coffee, slice of cake, chat. Open to all, very informal, no need to book, just turn up. All ages welcome!

NEWS FROM THE VILLAGES

Farming News

Twice recently as I drove down Bagmore Lane just before sunrise, a barn owl has flown out from the trees opposite the old Herriard station. He/she has then flown alongside me at about 20mph all the way to the farm where they drop into the old hay barn. I get a wonderful tracking view of the owl in flight. It's amazing what you see and hear in the countryside in the early hours.

I find, with Christmas being the same time every year and all the cows and heifers being in the barns for winter, that our work at that time of year is predictable and formulaic. We make sure all the cattle feed is in the right place before the holidays, the work rota is up together, everyone's family commitments are covered, and we all try and have some decent time off. Easter, on the other hand, is very different. We never know what the weather is going to throw at us, whether we will have cattle out or in, or if we'll be planting maize. Add to that that Easter moves around by nearly a month from late March to late April (over to you to explain that and the links with the moon please Simon!) and organising farm work and planning time off becomes tricky. This year for example has been the complete opposite to last. Whereas last year was wet, this year, as all you gardeners are well aware, has been drought like ...in March. I'm writing this in early April, sitting outside listening to the multitude of birdsong and it's gorgeous.

For the first time since 2022 we have managed to roll all our grassland with our heavy flat roller. The ground was too wet the last two years, but this year has been perfect, so finally we've managed to roll in all the flints (Hampshire Diamonds!), mole hills and cattle hoof prints and prepare our grass fields for grazing and silage making. Flat rolling also pushes the earth and the roots together after frosts lift the ground, this accelerates growth and in a dry spring like this, retains water.

We've been out removing fallen trees and limbs from the field borders which has the added side benefit of restocking our log sheds ready for next winter. Fences and gates have been mended where assorted winter wildlife have broken them. Our three teenagers have had fun dismantling an old, barbed wire fence around a large tree clump by removing the staples and attaching the old wire to the back of our battered Ford Ranger pickup and driving off pulling the wire out of the brambles. Not sure how well my health and safety briefing was adhered to mind!

We need the fences and gates to be in really good order, especially in the young stock fields because the 8 month old heifers have never been out of the barns before having been housed all autumn and winter. When we open the barn door and usher them out into the paddock it's such a joy. Some leap out of the barn and race off around the field straight away, the more timid ones, we have to literally manhandle out of the barn and once in the field it takes them a while to figure out their newfound freedom before they too are off around the field at a rate of knots. We'll feed them a 21% protein nut once a day when they are out at grass. When they are in the barns for winter, we feed them with the nut twice a day and bed and feed them with straw as well, so it's much more labour intensive and costly when they are in.

We are currently planting our maize into some very good seedbeds. Normally we are trying to obtain a nice dry seedbed but this year we are trying to retain as much moisture as possible. As soon as it is planted, we will spray with a pre-emergence herbicide to take out any weeds as they start to poke through. Rain is forecast midweek, and this will activate the herbicide, so fingers crossed our timing for planting has been spot on. Maize hates any kind of competition from other plants or soil compaction that inhibits its roots going deep, so we try to get it off to the best start we possibly can. Like most things in life, the care and attention spent that goes into the preparation, pays dividends later on.

The Skylarks have been in full song above our wheat fields this Easter and with the maize and grass growing, some of the cows out, the sun shining and warm rain forecast, we are looking forward with optimism.

Educational Grants available to ALL Upton Grey Residents

The Upton Grey Educational Trust was formed when the Upton Grey School was sold after its closure in the 1980s and half of the proceeds were put into a Trust.

The Trust can use the income from the investment twice yearly "for the advancement of education". The Trust meets in June and December each year to consider applications for assistance with educational needs, from any age group and with no means testing.

Since the Trust was set up, it has awarded grants to over 100 applicants and 16 groups in addition to Long Sutton School.

Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust – The vanishing call of Britain's lapwing

Spring in the British countryside once echoed with the distinctive, trilling call of the northern lapwing (*Vanellus Vanellus*), a striking black-and-white bird with a shimmering green back and a wispy crest. Also known as the peewit - after its haunting call - lapwings were once a common sight, but today their numbers are in serious decline.

Lapwings are an unmistakable part of the UK's natural heritage. Their dramatic, tumbling flight displays in early spring are a spectacle, as males perform acrobatic dives to impress potential mates. But while they may be bold in the air, they are incredibly vulnerable on the ground.

As ground-nesting birds, lapwings lay their well-camouflaged eggs in simple scrapes in mud or sand, on short grassland and arable land. This makes them highly susceptible to disturbance from people, livestock, and, crucially, off-lead dogs. A single frightened bird taking flight may not seem particularly noticeable, but if lapwings are repeatedly disturbed, they abandon their nests - leaving eggs or chicks exposed to predators and the elements.

Habitat loss has already pushed lapwing numbers into steep decline. Since 1967, the UK population has decreased by 55 per cent, earning them Red List status as a species of conservation concern. Loss of mixed farming, spring coppicing and the intensification of grassland management have all contributed to their struggles.

Many nature reserves managed by Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust provide nesting areas for various species of ground nesting birds, including Testwood Lakes Nature Reserve, near Southampton, which is home to breeding lapwings.

As a nation of dog lovers, we all want to enjoy the great outdoors with our furry companions. But we must also remember that we share these spaces with wildlife that depends on them for survival.

One of the biggest challenges is how difficult these nests can be to spot, even for trained eyes, in open locations where you would expect to see them. Their natural camouflage makes them blend seamlessly into their surroundings, increasing the risk of accidental disturbance.

By keeping dogs close by and under control during the groundnesting bird season, which lasts from now until late summer, we can help protect vulnerable birds and other species. Small changes in our behaviour can make a big difference, ensuring that future generations can continue to enjoy the sights and sounds of nature in our beautiful landscapes.
