From the Benefice Ministry Team

Many years ago Pauline and I were on a sailing trip and were told about a sea cave that was especially worth a visit. It was hard to find, but we were given very detailed instructions that involved getting on a ferry, walking across a small town, and then taking a small row boat to get into the cave itself. We carefully followed all our instructions, and were rewarded with one of the most beautiful sights I have ever seen — a small cave flooded with sunlight via a hole in the rocks which lit up the seawater a deep blue colour.



As we approach Christmas, this memory reminds me of how the Magi – the wise men – followed the star that led them to Jesus. In Matthew's gospel, we read that they travelled a complicated and circuitous journey from the East, probably a distance of more than 800 miles.



Matthew tells us that "the star they had seen in the East went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. On coming to the house where Jesus was, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshipped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh." (Matthew 2:9)

Christmas is a time when we too can 'follow the star' and discover the joy of knowing Jesus for ourselves. It is Jesus who came amongst us as a baby – God himself in human form – and it is he who went on to live a perfect, sinless life, but then - out of his great love for each one of us - died on the cross for us.

It's as we put our trust in him and choose to follow him that all our sins – all that we've ever done wrong, all the mess we make of things – are completely forgiven, and we get to live a 'new' life of freedom and fullness.

You may have seen posters around that say 'Wise men still follow the star'. Just like the wise men of old who heard the good news of Jesus and took action, so too each one of us can 'follow the star' today, by coming to worship him and following him in our own lives.

This Christmas we would like to invite you to come to church, to hear the Christmas story told once again, and to discover afresh the joy and the freedom we discover in Jesus. We'd also like to invite you to bring your friends with you! And to help with this we've joined in with a national initiative called 'Follow the Star – the Great Invitation'.



How about inviting five friends or

family to come to church with you sometime over this Christmas season? It's likely that this will be the best Christmas present you could possibly give them.

Jesus described himself as the "Light of the World". He is the one who is more powerful than any star in the sky, and who fills our lives – which can often feel dark and difficult – with light and love. He was the one who said "whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

Please do come and join us at our church services this Christmas, and discover this light of life for yourself.

And as we 'follow the star' together, we wish you a very happy Christmas.

In the meantime, happy creating, and I look forward to seeing you over the Christmas season!




What's on

NEWS FROM THE VILLAGES

Farming News

December on the farm is always a quiet time for us arable farmers with just a few 'odd jobs' to do along with washing down machinery before it is stored away for the winter. All the autumn-sown crops are in the ground and have established well so far. The last block of wheat to be drilled was delayed slightly as we were waiting for sewage sludge to be spread onto the fields, which we then turn around and cultivate to mix the manure in.

Since these fields have been cultivated and planted, we've had considerable rain; the cultivated top soil acts like a sponge and is very wet under the trees around parts of the headland where less sunlight reaches and on heavier clay soil, but the main part of the field is coping well. After such a long hot summer the soil has dried out considerably and the subsoil has cracked naturally meaning the soil structure can take/retain that much more water. It seems a distant memory when we were waiting for rain to be able to start planting the oil seed rape back in August.

We were very worried about the OSR in September and into early October as the flea beetle were back with a vengeance this year and were munching their way through the tiny plants that were just emerging. Compared to last year where we planted the OSR from 5th–15th August, this year we were two weeks later due to the lack of rain. This meant the emergence of the plant coincided with the migration of the flea beetle. Thankfully due to the warmer Autumn and early winter the OSR has managed to get some rest from the flea-beetle bite to be able to recover.

All the other crops are looking well albeit with a few tramlines in the wrong place down to the drill operator (me). We plant a mixture cover crops into the fields now that, later, will have spring-sown crops such as maize and barley. These have got away well this year and we're pleased with how they have grown, so much so that we are planning to graze them lightly with a neighbour's sheep which will benefit us both. The sheep can fatten up on the nutritious crop and deposit their 'byproduct' (muck) back onto the fields. Also this makes it easier to kill off the cover crop in the spring as it is not quite such a big plant to kill. The aim with using cover crops is to plant a mixture of species that have deep roots to break up subsoil compaction as well as particular plants that hold onto nutrients like Nitrogen, phosphate and potassium, which will benefit the following crop.

Our chickens are now unfortunately under 'flockdown' due to the rise in Avian flu across the UK. So we have made up a hard-standing base next to one of the barns to sit the hen house on. We have then netted off one of the sections of the barn and bedded it down with straw to give the hens more room to roam in during the day. The supermarkets are blaming

avian flu for the 'supply issues' that they are having, leaving the egg shelves bare. Which in part is correct but only because the cost of production has shot up since the start of the war in Ukraine. Every part of the industry has been affected with rising input costs. Thankfully we are very small producers compared to the farmers supplying supermarkets, who are dictated a price for their eggs regardless of the cost of producing them. Now having to keep the hens shut up means they eat more feed and require bedding as opposed to roaming the grass fields where they would graze the grass and forage on the bugs that live in the grass ley. Due to these increased costs, the farmers can only operate for so long whilst producing eggs at a loss. So inevitably they are getting out of it whilst they can and now the supermarkets are having to import eggs from Europe – complete bonkers when you think of carbon footprints and a secure food supply for the UK. Hopefully they will wake up to the issue and start paying a fair price so we can have British eggs back on the shelves.

Anyway that's enough 'preaching' for now and that just leaves me to wish you all a Happy Christmas and prosperous New Year from us all at Hyde Farm.



Herriard Gardening Club

Where has this year gone? Here we are in December with Christmas approaching fast. I think it's been one of the mildest autumns and early winters so far. I think the plants seem to think so too. They are reluctant to stop growing and flowering!

But here are a few jobs you can be getting on with this month. *Jobs for December*

- 1. Carry on collecting leaves from the garden, it reduces viruses and makes great leaf mould!
- 2. Plant any remaining tulips before Christmas. If they are in the ground, try and plant them as deeply as you can with added drainage.
- 3. We are all trying to use less plastic, so reuse your pots and labels. Give them a wash now, ready for spring. I reuse plastic vegetable containers as seed trays, just put a few holes on the bottom and they work brilliantly!
- 3. Hellebores look beautiful in winter and early spring; it's a good time to plant a few. They have deep roots so dig a big hole for them and incorporate some grit and compost to give them a good start.
- 4. Plant shallot sets close to the shortest day (Dec 21st) and they will be ready to harvest on the longest day (June 21st!)

Mothers' Union

awareness of gender-based violence. It is shocking that 1 in 3 women worldwide experience domestic or sexual abuse. Cases of domestic violence have increased during lockdown and the pandemic and so there is more need than ever to join together and say 'No more 1 in 3'.

Christians Against Poverty – Alton

I'm Steve Hannington and since January 2022 I've been Debt Centre Manager for the Alton branch of the charity, Christians Against Poverty, better known as CAP. We provide free help to anyone, regardless of background, in complete confidentiality.

Unmanageable Debt?

Our free CAP Debt Help Service has been running in the Alton area for over eight years. Over that time, we've got to know over 230 individuals or families locally who've needed help with debt. Most live in social housing and over half are single women, many of them single mums. If their main income is benefits, they may struggle to pay basic bills such as rent, council tax, or water bills – and this is often how they run up debts. We'll help anyone who has debts, whether it's £500 or £50,000 or more. And we don't judge anyone as to why they got into debt in the first place.

With CAP, our approach is to provide compassionate personal support – normally visiting people in their homes. We also offer to pray with them and, if they wish, tell them about Jesus. We achieve this in Alton through a great team of three Debt Coaches and about 25 helpers – all Christians – drawn from 11 local churches. We work with CAP's national headquarters to provide a professional debt service where the charity deals with all of a person's creditors until they get free of debt. In Alton we've succeeded in getting 71 households out of debt so far, which is a huge relief to those people, and several of our client friends have opened their lives to Jesus.

Out of work?

Since 2021 we have run a free CAP Job Club in Alton, meeting on Tuesday mornings. The Job Club offers practical help to identify strengths and skills, prepare a great CV and practise interview technique. Based on an 8-session course, and with one-to-one support from our trained Job Coaches, we provide a friendly, relaxed environment in which jobseekers can build their confidence and find work.

A life-controlling habit?

Another service that Harvest Church (Alton) provides is called Fresh Start. Fresh Start helps people who want to change a life-controlling habit such as smoking, gambling, over-eating, internet or social media addiction,

shopping compulsions, binge drinking, soft drugs, etc. A free 8-week course, inspired by the Bible and the Twelve Steps of Recovery principles, is led by four trained coaches who also offer 1-to-1 coaching. They group provides a confidential, supportive community where members meet regularly and work through a plan of action in order to break free from these dependencies. We've run ten courses in Alton, and members have successfully tackled habits of smoking, gambling, over-spending, alcohol and drugs.

Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust –Time for a ghost hunt?

The clocks have gone back, the nights are drawing in and the weather is on the turn. However, this doesn't mean the chances of seeing wildlife are gone. In fact, this time of year is fantastic for owl spotting.

As we head towards winter, barn owls, for example, will extend their hunting hours into daylight to find the extra food they need to get them through the colder months. These beautiful birds of prey, with their heart-shaped faces and ghost-white feathers, are perhaps one of the UK's most recognisable and cherished birds.

Barn owls can be spotted gliding through farmland, grassland, marshes, fens and cattle-grazed coastal fields, and they will even hunt alongside busy main roads. Masters of stealth, these predatory birds have evolved many impressive adaptations that make them expert hunters of small mammals. An old country name for this much-loved countryside bird is 'hushwing', which perfectly describes its silent, stealthy flight that helps it ambush unsuspecting prey. This smooth, ghostly, near-silent flight is achieved thanks to the trailing edge of its wing feathers being covered in soft, comb-like serrations that trap air and absorb noise.

Barn owls have incredible eyesight, too, which is specialised for hunting at night in total darkness – it's estimated their eyes are twice as sensitive to light as human eyes. They also possess camouflaged plumage, plus long legs and toes and sharp talons for snaring prey lurking in deep grass. Their heart-shaped facial discs, meanwhile, help funnel sound into a pair of highly sensitive inner ears that allow the birds to detect tiny

movements at ground level. In fact, barn owls are thought to have the most sensitive hearing of any animal in the world. Interestingly, unlike other owls, which hoot, barn owls make eerie screeching and hissing noises.

Generally, the best time to see them is at dawn and dusk on still, dry days. With such soft feathers, barn owl plumage isn't particularly waterproof and so they tend to avoid hunting during rainfall.

In our region, Hockley Meadows Nature Reserve in Winchester and Farlington Marshes Nature Reserve near Portsmouth are known to attract barn owls – the latter also hosts winter migrant short-eared owls.

Always remember to watch and photograph birds responsibly by keeping a good distance from wildlife, leaving no trace, and keeping dogs on leads at all times when visiting nature reserves.

From May 2020 to this September, it was a privilege to serve as Minister for International Trade, where I worked to back British businesses around the world, bulldozed 400 trade barriers, and secured trade deals. Between us, the then Trade Secretary – Liz Truss – and I reached free trade agreements with 71 countries around the world.

I am very grateful to her for appointing me as Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs on being made Prime Minister and, though we've had international economic challenges to deal with, I am pleased to have laid the groundwork to 'free our farmers' and to continue protecting our environment. After much work in my tenure, my successor will now be able to take forward the plans set in motion.

Heading into 2023, we have much to be thankful for, and much to look forward to. I will continue to work hard for the people of Upton Grey, Tunworth, Herriard, Weston Patrick and beyond, where it continues to be an enormous honour to serve as your local Member of Parliament.
