From the Benefice Ministry Team

January 6th is the Feast of the Epiphany; the twelve days of Christmas are over, the decorations have gone and we remember the three men, variously called Kings, Magi, Wise men – who have come from the East, following a star which led them to the infant Christ before whom they knelt down in homage and by offering their best gifts revealed just how special the child was.



Thinking about the three men reminded me of words from the Old Testament book Ecclesiastes: "A threefold cord is not quickly broken." The verses which contain those words begin: "Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their toil, for if they fall one will lift up his fellow; but woe to him who is alone when he falls and has not another to lift him up. Again if two lie together they are warm; but how can one be warm alone? And though a man might prevail against one who is alone, two will withstand him." In other words, we need each other.

Those three men would have needed one another on their long journey, for mutual encouragement and protection; they may have huddled together for warmth, perhaps one kept an eye on the star whilst the others slept.

The Wise men did not come from where you might expect and Christians come from all kinds of places and backgrounds because Jesus is for everyone. If they commit themselves to following Jesus, the bright morning star, they know that will need one another to encourage one another, to protect one another from the dismals when things go wrong and for the simple warmth of sharing in fellowship. They need one another to point out where Jesus might be leading and they most powerfully witness to who Jesus is when they work together, offering gifts which complement one another which is why the Week of Prayer for Christian unity at the end of January is important.

The beginning of a new year is a way point in our journey through life; so let's be thankful for the cords of friendship and fellowship which bind us together on our journey. At the same time not forgetting those who, for any reason, find themselves seemingly adrift without anyone or anything to hold on to - that this may be the year when they find a lifeline to hold on to - a cord which will not quickly be broken.

Message from the national Church

The Bishop of London, Dame Sarah Mullally, who leads the Church of England's Covid Recovery Group (and who is a former Chief Nursing Office for England) has written:

Services online or telephone based

With some parishioners not in a position to attend church services, the streamed services are continuing. Most services from All Saints Odiham are live-streamed (and then available online afterwards) - see the website www.moretolife.church for details.

In addition to streamed services, the Church of England has established 'Daily Hope', a telephone line offering music, prayers and reflections as well as full worship services from the Church of England. The line, which is available 24 hours a day on 0800 804 8044, has been set up particularly with those unable to join online church services in mind.

Private prayer

In this group of four churches, **St Mary's Upton Grey** is open every day - generally in daylight hours. **St Lawrence Weston Patrick** is open **Monday-Saturday** (and Sunday if there is a service), usually from **9.00am to 5.00pm** though times may vary. St Mary's Herriard and All Saints Tunworth are available for private prayer on the same basis as before Covid.

NEWS FROM THE VILLAGES

Superfast Fibre Broadband Update

Openreach are still forecasting that fibre will be installed throughout our community by the end of December, but I would expect some slippage on this.

Openreach will inform us when fibre goes live in the community and at this point you can order a fibre package from your broadband supplier. It also looks likely that going live may be phased. Openreach have also told me of a slightly more complicated process than they originally advised, which is as follows:

We now have two lists for our community.

1. Our original community fibre list

(go to www.uptongreyautumnfestival.co.uk then click on "Upton Grey Superfast Broadband" and then "Details of Openreach offer")

2. The voucher pledging list

(as above but click on "Voucher Pledging List")

Those on the voucher pledging list are those that the Openreach installation team consider having pledged their vouchers to Openreach and then confirmed this to the Government DCMS department. Some people who are not on this list believe they should be, but they are unlikely to get this changed and, as you will see, the result will be the same but with less liability. Those on the pledging list will have fibre laid to the outside wall of their properties before fibre goes live but will have previously pledged to contract for a fibre package within a month of fibre going live. Failure to do this *potentially* makes them liable for a fine equating to the value of the voucher - £3000 I believe.

Those not on the pledging list but on our community list will have fibre laid to their curtilage (nearest point on the public highway or footpath) before fibre goes live. They are under no obligation to contract for a fibre package at any time. Irrespective of pledging, everyone on the community list can contract for a fibre package from when we go live.

Openreach Customer Services advise that the resident's broadband supplier charges the same installation charge whether fibre must be connected from their outside wall or from the curtilage. I have checked this with BT's broadband sales department, and they confirm that they currently (and this is not expected to change in the foreseeable future) will supply a fibre service for everyone on our community list, irrespective of pledges and irrespective of whether from wall or

curtilage, for no installation charge. The only cost will be the cost of the fibre package (in my case it is much the same as my current package). I cannot speak for other broadband suppliers.

Some people (on the pledging list) are concerned that there is no sign of fibre being taken to their outside wall. This is normally because their current broadband comes to their house via a telegraph pole and fibre will follow the same route - which means no prior consultation is required and connecting the fibre cable is comparatively simple compared to the excavations that took place in Weston Close. Two Thefts from vehicles

On the 17th November, a passenger window of a vehicle was smashed whilst parked close to the village hall in Cliddesden. Unfortunately, personal possessions which had been inside the vehicle, and visible to anyone looking in, were stolen from inside the vehicle. This incident occurred within a very short period. We would like to reiterate NOT to leave personal possessions in your vehicle regardless of whether it is a short or a long period of time. Opportunistic thieves always work amongst us.

On the 4th December in Farleigh Wallop a similar report was received of a vehicle that also had its window smashed and two coats stolen from within. It's estimated the damage and theft amounted to a loss to the owner of around £250.

Three Road Traffic incidents

On the 23rd November on Bagmore Lane, a serious road traffic incident occurred which saw several emergency vehicles in attendance.

On the 25th November in the area of Farleigh Wallop, there was a head-on collision involving two cars on a narrow country lane. One driver was arrested having provided a positive breath test exceeding the legal alcohol limit.

On the 3rd December on the A339, a car hit an unknown object and the vehicle spun out of control trapping the driver.

Where do butterflies go in winter? - Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust

Think of butterflies and usually we associate them with sultry summer days, but have you ever wondered how these delicate insects survive harsh winters in the UK?

Butterflies are ectothermic – or cold-blooded – meaning they cannot regulate their own body temperature and instead rely on external heat sources to warm up. This is why butterflies perch on leaves to bask in the sun or, conversely, seek shaded spots to cool down. Butterflies struggle when sources of heat become harder to find, hence why British

winters pose a problem. To overcome temperate climates, butterflies have adapted in remarkable ways to survive.

The most common way butterflies overwinter in Britain is as either a caterpillar or a chrysalis. To protect their soft and vulnerable bodies, caterpillars find refuge at the bottom of plants or bury themselves in leaf litter or soil where they wait, hopefully undisturbed, until spring. This tactic is used by 42 of Britain's 59 butterfly species, including orangetips and common blue.

Another option, and one of the safest, is to wait it out as an egg. The brown hairstreak is one butterfly that employs this strategy.

Less common is the method chosen by five of the UK's most recognisable butterflies, namely brimstone, comma, peacock, small tortoiseshell and red admiral. These species overwinter in their adult forms and, in late summer or early autumn, will seek out safe and relatively warm spaces, such as inside sheds, garages, log piles or even rabbit holes. They wake when temperatures rise and so are occasionally seen on warmer days in the depths of December and January.

Finally, the humble painted lady butterfly escapes the cold of British winter by making an epic migration to northern Africa in an incredible quest for warmer climes.

Despite these mighty displays of adaption, butterfly numbers in Britain are decreasing rapidly. Formerly common species, like the small tortoiseshell, have fallen by 80% in Southeast England since 1990. However, there are several ways you can help these amazing insects:

- Delay cutting back old plants and tidying up leaf litter until spring to provide butterflies with places to overwinter.
- Leave a wilder area of your garden, with long grasses, ivy, shrubs, weeds and nettles to provide vital butterfly habitat.
- Plan to plant some nectar-rich plants in your garden or window box for butterflies when they wake up in spring. Pollinator-friendly options include cowslips, rosemary, forget-me-knots, bugle, Sweet William or heather.
- If you find a butterfly in your home, garage or shed, carefully catch the butterfly and place it in a cool spot. Once the butterfly settles you can gently move it to an unheated room in a shed, porch or garage. Remember to let the butterfly out of the building when it awakens in spring.

Have a say on water company's 25-year Environment Plan.

A unique draft 25-year Environment Plan written by South East Water now needs feedback from local residents on its strengths and weaknesses before it is published.

South East Water is the first UK water company to produce such a plan, following an intensive period working with its customers, employees and other environmental organisations to shape it. The appeal for feedback from local communities is the final stage before it is published in early-2022.

Not only does the plan set out how the company will limit its own impact on the environment, but, more importantly, how it will improve the overall health of the environment and increase its resilience to the effects of drought, flooding and growing demand for tap water.

Supplying drinking water to 2.2 million customers across the south east, the company maintains 83 water treatment works and 9,000 miles of underground pipes – enough to stretch from the South East of England to Australia - as well as 33 Sites of Special Scientific Interest, two local nature reserves, Lullington Heath National Nature Reserve and numerous Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

The water supplier also works with farmers, landowners, and other water users to protect the quality and quantity of the rivers and underground aquifers which are used to produce an average of 520 million litres of tap water each day.

The company is now looking to expand the work of its in-house team of environmental experts to work with other local companies and individuals to improve the environment within a generation.
