When the going gets tough, the tough get going. So goes the saying. Catchy though it is, I'd rephrase it: "When the going gets tough, the tough stay exactly where they are".

When the going gets tough, the tough resist the temptation to run away. The tough resist the temptation to try to escape to somewhere else. When the going gets tough, the tough face the difficulty because they are committed to the people they live amongst, and because they have placed their trust in a power greater than that which they can summons from themselves.

From what we know, our sovereign lady Queen Elizabeth II was undoubtedly tough – in the sense described above. For 70 years she steadfastly served the Commonwealth of Nations of which she was Head of State. Carefully, with great wisdom, and in the best of the Benedictine tradition of stability.

In the Benedictine tradition, stability is the 'staying put', the 'refusing to walk away', the 'being committed to those with whom we

live' no matter what the cost. Many words have been used to describe Her Majesty's reign, but one of the most common words I have heard is 'stability'. And it has been used, I think, either accidentally or deliberately, in the true sense. The Queen, in her faith, work and life, embraced and somehow exuded a sense of stability. Based on a deep commitment to both Jesus Christ and the people whom she was called to serve, this sense of stability manifested itself in numerous ways.

As we reflect on the life of Queen Elizabeth II, and in the midst of so much turmoil, perhaps we might be inspired and encouraged to pursue the same sense of stability that clearly both guided and anchored her?

Perhaps this is part of her lasting legacy? Something to imitate? Something to hold fast to? Perhaps we too might be a people who refuse to walk away in the face of challenge and difficulty? Perhaps we too will be a people who remain committed to those whom we live amongst, putting down deep roots which help to hold our community together? Perhaps we too will be people who base our stability on deep faith in the plans and purposes of God and our role within them?

In his excellent speech in parliament Boris Johnson asked the question of why so many of us are feeling such a deep and personal sense of loss at the death of our Queen. Why this loss feels almost familial? It's a good question – after all, few of us knew her personally. For almost all of us she was a figurehead, viewed from afar... and yet her loss does feel significant, and deeply so.

I hazard to suggest that this is in part due to the stability on which we are reflecting. That somehow this stability, rooted in a deep commitment to not walk away, connects with us, inspires us, and shows us something profoundly good and, dare I say it, of God. It shows us something for which we long and yet find so difficult to obtain. Someone who is committed to us, who will not leave us or forsake us, who will not turn their back in times of trial and difficulty, but who will remain steadfast and true.

In this, Her Majesty reflected for us something profound about the God of the Church of whom she was defender. The God whom she sought to follow. Perhaps our sense of loss is so keenly felt because in our Queen we have glimpsed something of God's faithfulness and consistency and stability – and, unsurprisingly, this resonates deeply with us.

And so, we give thanks to God for her life. We trust that Queen Elizabeth now rests in peace and will at the resurrection rise in glory and worship the splendour that is the King of Kings and the Lord of Lords.

But there's a lot more to the service than that! It's a time when we remember that Jesus said 'I am the light of the world'. Why would he say that? What's so important about light?


I wonder if you can find all the words about light in the wordsearch below - and, while you do, have a little think about why light is so important to us...

Local Farming Report

Sunday the 14th of August saw the end to our combinable harvest. The earliest that I have ever known, although I hear from the more experienced farmers that there was an earlier harvest in the year of 1976. Certainly, a harvest to remember, with good yields and some record yields for a couple of fields on the farm. Long hot summer days means we were able to start harvest earlier in the mornings and did not have to work late into the evenings, which makes for more sociable working hours! Thankfully, we escaped any fire incidents, unlike some other farmers across the UK. It has been a very abnormal summer weather wise; I did not have to scroll through the various weather apps (I have on my phone) to check the forecast - as it was only sun and there was no risk of rain at all! This was one of the many perks.

Our first crop to harvest this year was the Oil Seed Rape. This was a welcome return to our cropping rotation on the farm, after a few tricky years trying to successfully grow it, due to the onslaught of flea beetle, mimicking locusts, as it eats the crop before it gets a chance to establish itself; this is to out compete its predators. Due to the weather (sorry more weather chat), we were having to harvest in the early hours of the day, with the hope that the grain wasn't too dry. Of all the harvests where we are praying for dry weather to dry out the grain; oil seed rape needs to be no drier than 6% moisture - but no more than 9%! This is so that the Pressing Plants that we sell the grain to can easily extract the oil from the seed. The winter sown crops have had near on perfect weather for them to reach their full potential, which goes to show that we as farmers can only do so much; and it is down to mother nature on how our growing year is to be. The wheat was a highlight for us, the main reason being that the grain weight was a lot higher. Each grain was fully formed, as opposed to other years where there has been plenty of grain but not filled out - and these were pinched, making them weigh less. The turmoil over in the Black Sea continues - but there has been movement of ships with grain onboard, and this has brought the price down on our crops. A further effect is that fertiliser prices have started to climb back up again, which we plan to mitigate by using more organic fertilisers like digestate slurry and muck, to help keep the costs down.

The only crop to disappoint this harvest was the spring sown beans, they didn't get enough rain at the right time to germinate properly, and they struggled from then on. We chose to plant beans due to the high fertiliser price. Beans are part of the 'legume' family, they are able to 'fix' their own nitrogen (fertiliser). They also leave residual soil fertility for the following crop.

So, by using them in the rotation we can reduce fertiliser for the next crop. The final crop to harvest this year is the Maize, and, as I write this, we have started harvesting with a few days left before we finish. The crop on the chalkier soil has struggled, but on the higher clay content soil the crop is looking better - but certainly no record yields this year. We have already planted the oil seed rape for harvest 2023, which is starting to emerge now, and hopefully will get going in the next week or so. Thankfully for the rain, the ground has softened up and has made it easier for us to create a tilth, ready to start planting wheat in early October. Will Cheyney

A day in the life of a Wildlife Trust reserves officer – Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust

Across Hampshire & the Isle of Wight, the Wildlife Trust manage over 60 nature reserves. These precious sites are sanctuaries for some wonderful wildlife, including many endangered species.

The charity's vital conservation work to help nature's recovery is only possible thanks to the support of its loyal members, devoted volunteers and dedicated staff.

One of those staff members is Sam Martin, an assistant reserves officer who cares for several reserves in the Winchester area, including Hockley Meadows Nature Reserve. Here, he describes how he got into conservation, what his job entails and the best and most challenging parts of his role.

"I joined Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust on a trainee programme four years ago. Before that I was grinding as a waiter while studying for a degree in Environmental Management at the University of Reading. After graduating I pursued as many volunteering opportunities as possible, many of which with the Wildlife Trust, and eventually a job became available.

My responsibilities include managing teams of volunteers, carrying out habitat management, caring for our grazing animals (native cattle, sheSep and New Forest ponies), doing species surveys, leading guided walks and talks for the public, and acting as a warden at our nature reserves.

Usually, I'll leave my home in Southampton at 7.45am and commute to our base in Winchester. One of the great things about my job is it's super varied depending on the time of year – a typical day as a reserves officer doesn't really exist.

During summer, for example, I'm carrying out lots of species surveys, warden duties and tractor operations. Moving into autumn and winter, I'll be clearing scrub and felling trees to improve our special chalk downland and fen habitats. Then, in spring, I'll be involved with fence building and other infrastructure works.

I generally try to head off by 4.30pm, which lets me beat the traffic and gives me time to catch up on some admin tasks, like emails, at home on the laptop.

The part of my job I really like is working with our amazing volunteers, especially on practical tasks like fencing, which are great team building exercises. Being around our British white cattle is always a joy too – they have great characters!

I'm also incredibly lucky to see some awesome wildlife. I remember staying late one evening with a colleague to treat a lame cow; the sun had almost set and the sky had a dull glow, and we felt a presence nearby – we looked up and a barn owl was effortlessly gliding above hunting for small mammals.

In terms of challenges, weather is the main one as I work outdoors most of the time – the best-laid plans can go out the window if there's high rainfall, soaring temperatures or strong wind. As a reserves team we've not yet sussed out how to control the weather!"


