From the Benefice Ministry Team

The last eighteen months of the pandemic have been very strange times, and it's only now, when most of the restrictions have lifted and some elements of 'normal life' have resumed, that we've been able to see how much has changed.


Aside from the tragic loss of so many lives, one thing that seems to be widely felt is a sense of confusion and disorientation that the pandemic has brought about. It's been easy to lose our sense of what's most important in life, and even what life is all about.



Across our benefice churches at the moment we're wrestling with just this issue. We're spending some weeks looking at the book of Ecclesiastes in the Old Testament, and much of the book reflects on these questions. The writer is struggling with these issues, and rather cynically says 'meaningless, meaningless, all is meaningless.' He says 'what do people gain from all their toils under the sun?'

Ecclesiastes raises the questions that the New Testament answers. Meaning is found not 'under the sun', but *in* the Son - Jesus Christ. It's through him that we can truly know God and be known by Him, and this is where we find meaning, and the hope of abundant life now and eternal life beyond. Jesus said, 'This is eternal life: that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent' (John 17:3).

A few days ago a friend of mine posted online this remarkable photo of a mountain goat.



He mentioned that there's one thing he loves about this image... It's not the fact that this mountain goat is about to make a massive leap which, if done wrong, could alter the rest of his life... It's not the fact that he even had enough faith to do so!

What he loves is that the goat's eyes are focused on one thing only – his final destination. He's not looking down wondering if he's going to fall to his death. He's not looking behind him regretting the decision he made, wondering what would happen if he took a different route to his final destination. His focus is on one thing only – the other side.

And this is so true in our own lives. We find meaning once again as we fix our eyes on God. Not distracted by looking down or behind or around, but focused on him.

As we come out of lockdown, one of the best ways of fixing our eyes on God is by worshipping him in church each Sunday. I know from my own experience that the lockdown has meant that we've got out of the habit of meeting together to worship on Sundays. But I've heard so many people over the last few weeks reflecting that, as they've come back to church, so they've re-discovered God's love for them, they've found a fresh purpose and peace in their lives, and the confusion of the pandemic has receded.

M3 Junction 6 The Moto Services proposal hasn't gone away

This article is to thank the many local residents who have already taken the trouble to write in and object. It is possible this proposal may come forward for determination at Basingstoke Planning Committee's meeting on October 6th.

Despite what some may say, and the misrepresentations in Moto's proposals, this battle is far from lost. Our local Councillors remain strongly opposed to Moto's applications and it is our hope that this view is widely shared by other Councillors wishing to protect Basingstoke. We have an adopted local plan, and this development forms no part of any current local requirement and is not needed.

Of 368 public comments lodged only two support the proposal. A further 62 comments object to the proposed construction access road onto Dickens Lane close to the junction with the A339. Objectors are universally against this additional road access which is plain dangerous and which will also cause more congestion at the Hackwood roundabout. In taking their decision Councillors will need to review more than 1000 individual documents that have been lodged over nearly four years that these proposals have taken to come to this point.

Farming news - October

We are now heading towards the harvest suppers and harvest festivals in our parishes. The churches will look stunning in their autumnal displays and the farmers will no doubt let out a little snigger as we sing 'soft refreshing rain'!

Although we didn't have much rain in August, the lack of sunshine made harvesting and then baling the straw very difficult. The straw just wouldn't dry enough to make decent bales. Ideally the moisture content wants to be below 16% otherwise the bales will go mouldy. We spent many an unproductive, cloudy afternoon driving around with our tractor and baler trying different fields of straw we had cut to bale, only to return to the farm later having done nothing because the straw was too damp. After a particularly overcast, frustrating evening I jumped into the tractor to return to the farm and on the radio they were playing Mr Blue Sky by ELO... I won't repeat the words I muttered!

Will may possibly reflect in later articles on a difficult, grey harvest which has been a real challenge at times but at least the cloudy skies and lower temperatures have meant happier cows here at the dairy.

The cows have really benefited from the cooler summer. Anything over 20 degrees and they start to get uncomfortable. We have Mike, our cow nutritionist who analyses our grass and maize silage and formulates a ration to keep the cows fit not fat whilst producing good quantities of milk. He likens the cows' energy requirement to being even greater than that of the most supreme athlete and at the top of that list is the solo polar explorer. Explorers' energy requirements are huge because they have to combat the cold along with enormous physical exertion over long periods. When you see a cow lying down chewing her cud and looking chilled, she's actually working incredibly hard which is why the cooler temperatures suit them. On very hot days you may see groups of cows in fields bunched together swishing their tails trying to keep cool, they are not happy cows. Our milking-cows sleeping on their cool sand beds in the shade of the barns are much more content than the cows out at grass when it's so hot.

I still find it fascinating that these ruminants with their four stomachs can turn the abundant feed source, grass, that we can't utilise, into milk, meat and leather. Our bond with the cow goes back thousands of years and is maybe only equalled by our working relationship with the horse and the dog. Cows get a bad press because of their methane emissions but the science behind that is changing. I'll explain more in later articles but perhaps the cow is not as big a problem as the popular press makes out.

Phil, Liam, Dan and I finished baling and hauling the straw to the barn at 8.30pm on Wednesday 8th September as the first spots of rain came down and lightning was flashing in the distance, so just in the nick of time. We grabbed some beers and sat in the old dairy looking out at the cows lazing in the barn and listening to the rain on the roof. Relief and satisfaction that the corn and straw are safely gathered in.....just maize harvest to go!

The Upton Grey Educational Trust was formed when the Upton Grey School was sold after its closure in the 1980s and half of the proceeds were put into the Trust. The Trust can use the income from the investment twice-yearly 'for the advancement of education'.

Herriard Gardening Club

September was a busy month in my garden, with laurel and deciduous mixed hedges needing to be cut back and the prunings taken to the Green waste recycling centre. Then, with a period of hot, September weather, we have been watering the beds to stop flowering perennials wilting. In between all that, the weeds were kept on top of and deadheading done to extend the flowering season.

My wildflower meadow patch was sown late, after the first sowing didn't germinate, and is now looking a picture with an abundance of Oxeye daisies, and some cornflowers and poppies. Wildflower seeds can be sown now on lighter soils. On heavy waterlogged soils it is advisable to wait until March or April as they may rot during winter. A wildflower patch is one of the easiest ways to encourage pollinators into the garden

In my cutting garden at the Gardening Club allotment, the Dahlias are giving their usual prolific display. I use them for bouquets and for the house. In order to get the long stems, I disbud the two side buds from a main stem to let the energy go into the dominant bud. I leave the tubers in the ground over winter but with a thick mulch of compost or Strulch to protect them and they have been coming up for the last three years.

The allotment holders have barely managed to keep up with the harvest of raspberries, courgettes, runner and French beans, greenhousegrown cucumbers and chard. An old broken bench was upcycled by Debbie Bridle and a sturdy new bench has been made by Bob Nash. Thanks to Debbie and Bob, we now have a communal place to sit and have a break.

Late summer or early autumn is the right time to take cuttings. They are taken using the current season's growth, but with stems starting to ripen so the base of the cutting is firmer. Try taking cuttings of fuchsia, hydrangea, penstemon, salvia, weigela, cistus or lavender. Remove the lowest leaves, snip off the tip leaving a pair of leaves at the top, insert into small pots filled with 50:50 peat-fre compost mixed with perlite or grit. Keep moist, but not wet, and out of direct sunlight.

Gardening jobs for October:

- 1. Leave some flower seed heads such as alliums and sunflowers in situ in the garden for the birds
- 2. Large clumps of crocosmia can be lifted and divided ready for replanting into freshly prepared soil.
- 3. Peas and beans can be cut down to ground level and their roots left in the soil, to break down and return nitrogen to the soil. Broad beans can be sown this month for early pickings in May and June next year.
- 4. Plant onion sets, shallots and garlic for the best sized bulbs next year.
- 5. Earth up leeks to cover and blanch stems

Andy Reid - Police Report from the past

Below are just a few cases heard at Basingstoke Divisional Petty Sessions in one day on July 26th 1905.

Before Dr Hayes and S E Bates, a number of motorists were summoned for exceeding the speed limit at Nateley Scures over a measured quarter-of a mile, which included the cross roads at the bottom of Scures-hill.

Mr. Somers Somerset, son of Lady Henry Somerset, the Liberal candidate for Croydon, was summoned for exceeding the speed limit and was fined £5 and costs inflicted. Also Mr. W. C. Dunn, of Hampstead, London, was fined £5 and 14 shillings costs for driving at a speed of 34 miles an hour. Mr. Thomas Hawkes of Vauxhall, London was fined £5 and costs for driving at a speed of 29 miles an hour, and Mr. A. R. Gravener from Aldershot was fined £5 and costs for driving a 16 horse-power motor car at a speed of 30 miles hour.

As today, speeding was a problem on the main roads across the country. The Motor Car Act was passed in 1903 following the previous Locomotives on Highways Act of 1896 (which had increased the speed limit for cars from 4mph in a rural area and 2mph in a town to 14mph!).

This new 1903 act allowed for a speed of 20mph(!) on the roads and also brought in vehicle registration so every vehicle had to be registered with the County or Borough Council and it was mandatory to display a number plate at all times. Driving licences were introduced at the same time, though no one, then, took a driving test.

The police enforced the speed limit by having a constable wave a flag or make a gesture to another officer further down the road when a car had passed him. This officer would then start a stop-watch and, when the car had travelled the allotted distance, would stop the timer and pull the car over. The time would be calculated and if found that the distance covered was driven in less time than it would take to cover the same distance at 20mph, then the car had exceeded the speed limit.

Today we have average speed cameras which work by recording your speed at two different points. They don't capture your speed in a single flash. Instead, they'll monitor your speed over a length of road. This is so people don't slow down just before they see a camera and then speed up again afterwards. They help to keep the traffic flowing steadily instead of stopping and starting.

The secret life of harvest mice – Hampshire & IofW Wildlife Trust Of the fourteen species of rodent commonly found in Britain, one of the least familiar of these is the harvest mouse, Britain's smallest rodent.

Harvest mice are not especially fussy, they are happy anywhere there are ample stems for them to clamber up, very rarely descending to the ground if they can avoid it. They are tiny: around 6cm long, with a tail close to the same length. The tail is used to help with balance and climbing. They react quickly to disturbance, disappearing back into the vegetation in response to nearby noises.

Although they are thought to be fairly widespread, they are difficult to find – often the only indication of their presence their intricate nests, which are carefully woven from grass and leaves within dense vegetation, so even these are difficult to spot! Harvest mice adapted to farmed habitats by creating their nests in crop fields such as wheat and barley, but modern combine-harvesters are a new threat. When fields were hand-cut, the mice could run to the safety of field margins, but modern machinery does not give them the time to escape. They also live in verges, reed beds and grassy hedges – habitats which have often been lost to development.

Recent studies have helped shine a light on these elusive little creatures, and more must be done to protect them. They seem able to respond quickly to changes in habitat, if the habitat is connected to others

and buffer zones exist between developments and their living space. Reintroductions can work well, as the mice are easy to breed and, once conservation efforts are in place, they colonise the reintroduction area quickly. The more we learn about marginal habitats like road verges and field edges, the more they are shown to be important for all sorts of wildlife, including our smallest rodent.


