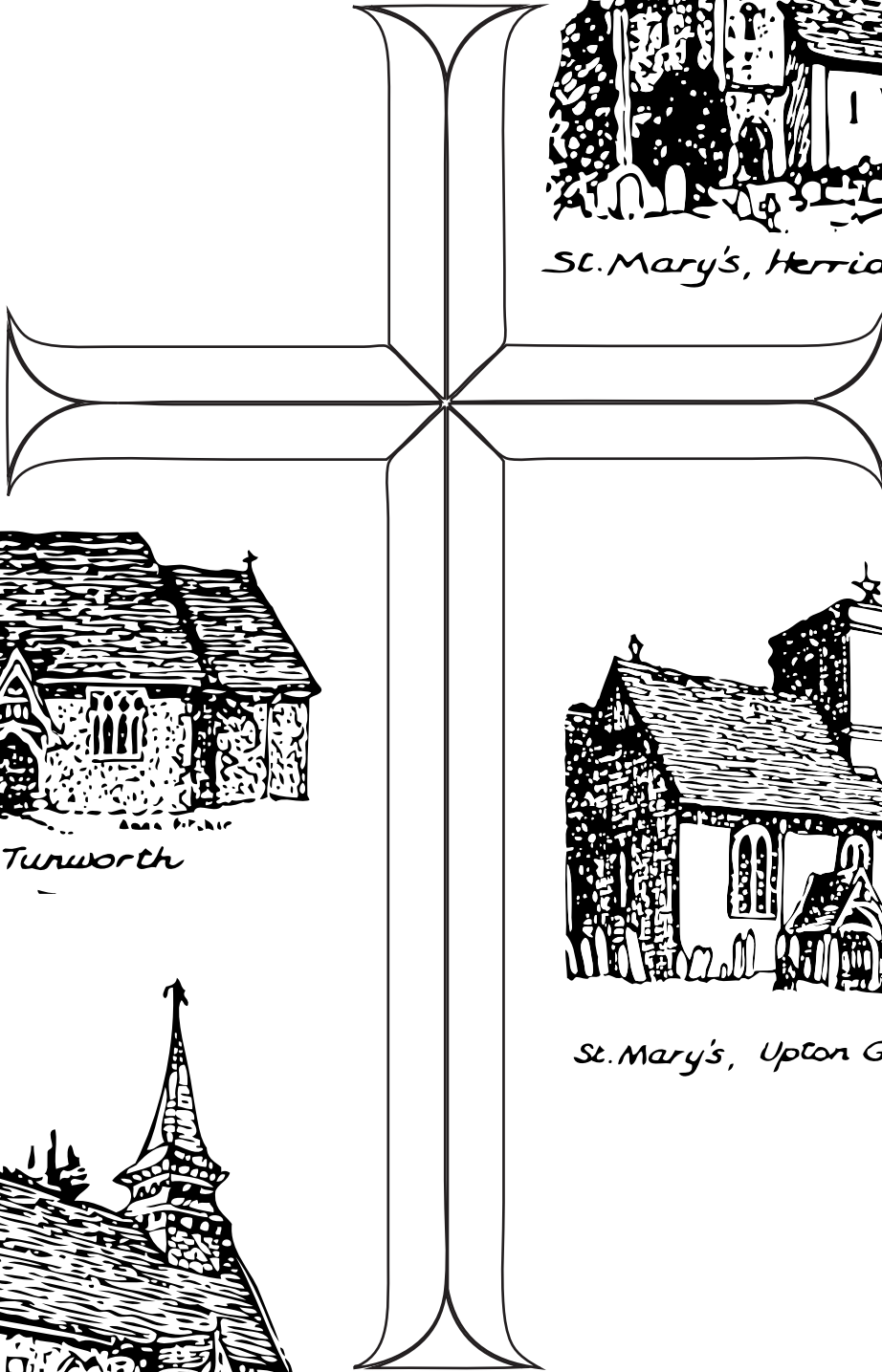

Letter from the Ministry Team

One of my favourite quotes is by Corrie ten Boom, who said this: ‘When a train goes through a tunnel and it gets dark, you don't throw away the ticket and jump off. You sit still and trust the engineer.’

We're all going through uniquely difficult and challenging times at the moment, with Covid-19 resulting in the loss of loved ones, restrictions on our freedoms, worsening mental health issues, and increased unemployment and financial hardship for so many. It can indeed feel like we're going through a dark tunnel.



Corrie ten Boom was a Dutch Christian, who lived through the most extreme suffering. During the second world war, she and her sister were caught helping Jews escape from the Holocaust, and as a result they were sent to Ravensbrück concentration camp, where her sister died. Corrie survived and her quote about ‘sitting still and trusting the engineer’ when we're going through a dark tunnel, was born out of her own experience, and refers to trusting God when things seem particularly bleak.

Sometimes trusting God when in the midst of dark times can seem particularly hard. But Jesus, who endured the most terrible suffering on the cross because of his love for us, tells us that as we trust him, as we walk with him, he will carry our burdens and restore us. In Matthew's gospel he said: ‘Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light.’ (Matthew 11: 28-30)

So as we progress through this dark tunnel that we currently find ourselves in, let's turn once again to God, and put our trust in him afresh each day. One way of doing this is simply to speak to God in prayer, saying that we don't know what's going on, things are difficult, but we trust him – and we need his help.

Another way of turning to God that I find helpful is to read the Psalms in the Bible. These are full of references to how as we put our trust in God, so he restores us, takes away our fear, helps us, and renews our hope and joy. A great example, from Psalm 28, is this: ‘The Lord is my strength and my shield; my heart trusts in him, and he helps me. My heart leaps for joy, and with my song I praise him.’

As we go through this dark tunnel together, let's put our trust once again in God, our creator, our saviour and our sustainer. Let's draw close to him anew each day, that our hope and joy might once again be restored.

Public worship in churches

Christmas services

Our December seasonal services will naturally look very different this year – please keep an eye open for details in the December magazine.

Services online or telephone based

With some parishioners not in a position to attend church services, the streamed traditional Sunday service is continuing. It is available from 9.15am – search YouTube for ‘North Hampshire Downs Churches’. (Please note that the time of the ‘premiere’ is now 9.15 rather than 9.00.)

In addition to streamed services, the Church of England has established ‘Daily Hope’, a telephone line offering music, prayers and reflections as well as full worship services from the Church of England. The line, which is available 24 hours a day on 0800 804 8044, has been set up particularly with those unable to join online church services in mind.

Private prayer

Most of the twelve North Hampshire Downs churches are available for private prayer and quiet reflection at some point during the week. In this group of four churches:

- **St Mary’s Upton Grey** is open for private prayer from 10.00am to 5.00pm on Wednesdays and Sundays.
- **St Lawrence Weston Patrick** is open for private prayer on Thursdays from 3.00pm to 4.00pm.
- **St Mary’s Herriard** and **All Saints Tunworth** are traditionally kept locked, but access for private prayer is now possible again in the same ways as before lockdown.

Never Forgets...

Even though it's a very old tradition, it still is really important today, as we remember not only those who go to war who may die or have their lives affected, but also their families as they try to deal with their grief or the sadness of how much their lives have changed as a result of war and the innocent people who are affected by wars as they are being fought.

God knows that People are still being persecuted and treated badly all over the world and sometimes we have to stand up for those people, which might even mean other countries fighting for them.

In The Bible there is a passage in Matthew which says:
 “Happy are those who work for peace; God will call them his children!”

Use a ruler and draw two lines horizontally across the middle of the plate. Cut out both (in)sides. Cut individual cups out of the egg carton and paint red. Let dry then paint the middle black. Paint the plate green. Glue on the poppy flowers and write “remember” in the middle.

Police Report from PC Andy Reid

Dear Residents

I am appealing for any information in relation to the recent damage caused at the Upton Grey playground in which the matting and some of the equipment have suffered from damage caused by fire. I have no doubt that someone in the village has knowledge of who did this and I ask for that person to please give me a call direct. I can assure you that all calls and any information will be treated in the strictest confidence. I further ask all parents to ask their children if they can assist and who may have some knowledge. It is important that we find out who is responsible, if you can help please give me a call direct.

We are also experiencing an increase in poaching at the moment where recently two hares were found shot and left by a gateway in Weston Patrick. I ask if you see any vehicles on the land at night, or lamps being panned across the fields, please give us a call. Those who are lawfully out doing vermin control would have made the Police aware before going out.

As the evenings are now drawing in I urge all residents to make sure homes are secured, lights etc. left on. Please make sure your home looks as if it is occupied when you are out. Whilst we have only had two house burglaries across the area during 2020, I would not like to see any increase.

There are still several scams doing the rounds, one latest concerned a cold caller from telephone number 01174433677 offering services, usually it rings then hangs up when asking for home owner? If

you receive any such calls please place the number into Google and if it is a scam number it will frequently show up on the internet as such.

Farming News

With the autumn drilling campaign well underway, with the majority of crops planted, we have just under 400 acres left to plant as I write this. As I have written before, we aren't growing Oil Seed Rape this year, instead we have grown more Winter Linseed and have drilled some Winter Oats which we haven't grown for a few years.

Over the last three years we have been moving over to a lower disturbance method of establishing our crops. As an industry there is a shift going on to improve soil health, and one main way of doing this is by not ploughing and pulling numerous cultivators through the soil that destroy the soil structure and soil biology just to make a seedbed. Instead we are 'Direct Drilling' more of our crops as long as the soil conditions allow us. The aim is to direct drill as much as possible, but there are cases when a cultivator is needed to lift compaction left from vehicle movements, or as the weather is starting to turn wetter we could lightly cultivate the top to help the soil dry before drilling.

Along with this drilling method we are now planting 'Cover Crops' into the fields that will be drilled in the spring, also for the first time this year for us we planted a 'Catch Crop' that we drilled after the Hybrid Rye was forage harvested in July. The Catch Crop contained a mixture of plant species, and in the mixture that we planted were Phacelia, Tillage Radish, Mustard, Buckwheat, Oil Radish and clover. The aim of this was to catch any nutrients in the soil so they are readily available for the following cereal crop to be planted.

I have seen plenty of people in farming magazines and online videos of farmers drilling crops into a tall plant biomass that were as tall as waist high with the assurance that this is the future and how we will all be establishing our crops in years to come, but putting it into practice was bit nerve racking – thinking of ways that it could go wrong, like if the drill couldn't handle the mass of plants and would just keep blocking up, to creating a haven for slugs that would be waiting to munch on the Oats that we'll plant into the Catch Crop. But I was pleasantly surprised, with no blockages at all, and the radishes had done a great job of breaking up the soil with their big roots, so the drill cut a nice slot and

buried over the Oats. Now, two weeks on, there are healthy rows of Oats growing amongst a mulch left behind from the Catch Crop.

As I was working my way across the field with the drill I noticed the small group of House Martins holding onto the last of the sunshine we got in late September, and realised they were swooping down to feed on the bugs and flies that were attracted to the Catch Crop. This proved that, as we move into the future of agriculture, this was the route we would want to be taking, working with nature. These fields of Oats are planted on the hill of Weston Corbett, with the footpath running through the middle as a reference for people that are interested to see how it progresses through the year.

News from Long Sutton C of E Primary School

We have certainly noticed the benefits, through a very smooth start to the new term, where almost all children already felt comfortable and confident returning to 'almost normal' school life, as they had had the opportunity to return in some form before the summer: worth every penny of additional staffing costs!

The support of the wider community can also be seen through the refurbishment of our school library, a project we have been planning and seeking funding for since 2019. The children are so excited to see the new library taking shape, and we are particularly grateful to the Friends of Mapledurwell Church Trust who made a generous donation towards some bookshelves. Once the library is complete, we shall post some pictures on our school facebook page and website.

Our PTA have funded the purchase of some new laptops and iPads, using funds raised last year, and now have their sights set on supporting us even further to expand these resources, as well as other IT hardware purchases. This year, due to Covid restrictions, they are having to think more creatively about fundraising and they have already made a great

start. All children are being encouraged to take part in the sponsored '1000 mile challenge' across October. We hope to reach 1000 miles collectively as a school, encouraging active lifestyles whilst at the same time raising PTA funds. The PTA will also be selling their now famous Christmas trees once again this year – please see the information later on in this magazine.

Even though our Reception children have only just begun their journey with us, we are already looking ahead to admissions for 2021. If your child is due to start school in September 2021, please look out for our school flyers and contact the school office to sign up for our open day events. We are having to do things very differently this year, as we cannot welcome visitors into school in the usual way, but we are still determined to give prospective families a chance to get a feel for what makes our school special. Herriard Garden Club

November is here and there is plenty to do in the garden.

1) Now is the time to cut down and bisect /rearrange your perennials, then mulch the soil with garden compost. Make sure the roots do not dry out and give some to your other gardening friends.

2) If your roses have Black Spot, collect fallen leaves so as not to carry disease over to next year, dispose of them in your local garden waste collection or burn where allowed. Protect your roses from wind-rock by pruning them one-third to half to prevent roots coming loose.

3) Lift pots onto bricks or pot feet to prevent water logging.

4) Clear fallen leaves from lawn and ponds but leave them within your beds to help the wildlife, also leave some of your hollow stem plants, so that insect can climb inside to hibernate and be protected.

5) Plant Tulip bulbs for a spring display these need to be planted two/three times depth of bulb.

6) Lift Dahlia Tubers after first frost, clean of excess soil and store in dry compost in a cool frost-free place or if leaving in the ground cover with thick layer of straw and mulch well.

7) Prune Autumn Raspberries to the ground, also prune fruit bushes once dormant, including Redcurrants, Blackcurrants and Gooseberries.

Please leave water and food out for the birds.

Recipe: Braised Red Cabbage, Apples and Sausage

2 Apples (eating cut into 10 wedges each apple).

8 Sausages of your choice.

1 large onion (thinly sliced).

Half Red Cabbage quartered, cored and shredded.

1 tbsp brown sugar and 1 tbsp water (or drizzled honey).
 2 tbsp red wine vinegar plus 1 tsp
 2 tsp sunflower or vegetable oil.
 Seasoning.

Method: In a non-stick frying pan heat 1tsp oil and brown the sausages on all sides about 5 minutes until brown, remove from pan to a plate. In the pan add the onion for a few minutes with the other 1 tsp oil, then add 1tsp red wine vinegar and apples and cook over a medium heat until apples and onion start to soften. Add the cabbage, sausages, 2 tbsp red wine vinegar, brown sugar and water (or honey if preferred) and add seasoning. The pan will initially be full but cover and cook for approximately 20 minutes stirring occasionally. The cabbage should be tender and the sausages cooked through. Serve with Mashed Potatoes. **Pat Pegg**

North Hampshire Downs Mother's Union



During October we were encouraged to think about and pray for those in prison. The Visitor Centre at Winchester Prison is currently closed, but families are now able to visit although sadly they have to wait outside in the rain before going into the prison.
